Description:

The old Fort Foote School building at 8400 Oxon Hill Road is set on a town lot, just south of the road. It is rectangular in plan, two-and-one-half-stories tall, aluminum sided with a steeply pitched gable roof covered with asphalt shingle. An interior brick chimney at the gable ridge is centered in the building. The north gable end has a central entrance with a modern door, plain wood lintel and wood surround with banded molding. A large, modern 12-light window is west of the door on the first story. There is a wide boxed cornice with overhanging eaves. The east and west facades are unfenestrated. There is a brick foundation. A shed roof, cement block one-story addition across the south facade was a porch that has been enclosed.

Significance:

The Fort Foote School property was acquired by the Board of County School Commissioners in 1883. The school was probably built soon thereafter. The building appears on the 1894 Hopkins Map of the Vicinity of Washington, D.C. It was used as a school until 1926, when the property was sold and the pupils transferred to Oxon Hill Consolidated School. The building has been significantly altered on the exterior and interior. The school was two stories, the lower floor for the early grades and the upper floor for grades five through nine. The interior had vertical wood wainscoting, some of which remains. The wooden door and window surrounds were banded, with bull's eye corner blocks. The exterior was German sided, with a central entrance on the north gable end, of double doors with a transom. The building was three by four bays, with 6/6 double hung sash windows on both stories. After 1926 the building had varied uses. It was in bad repair when the present owner acquired it in 1963. It has been covered with aluminum siding and renovated inside for use as a storage warehouse.

The old Fort Foote School building at 8400 Oxon Hill Road is set on a town lot, just south of the road. It is rectangular in plan, and approximately two-and-one-half-stories tall, with aluminum siding and a steeply pitched gable roof covered with asphalt shingle. There is an interior brick chimney at the gable ridge, approximately centered in the building.

The north gable end, facing Oxon Hill Road, has a central entrance with a modern door. The door has a plain wood lintel and a wood surround with banded molding. There is a large, modern 12-light window to the west of the door on the first story. There is a louvered rectangular opening centered in the gable end. There is a wide boxed cornice on the east and west sides of the building, and overhanging eaves.

The east and west sides of the structure are unfenestrated. A brick foundation is visible below the aluminum siding. The south side of the building has a shed roof, cement block one-story addition across the facade. This was a porch that has been enclosed, according to the owner. It has a poured cement floor.

The Fort Foote School property was acquired by the Board of County School Commissioners in 1883.¹ The school building was probably built soon thereafter. The building appears on the 1894 Hopkins Map of the Vicinity of Washington, D.C. It was used as a school until some time shortly before 1926, when the property was sold by the Board of Education and the pupils transferred to Oxon Hill Consolidated School.²

The building has been significantly altered on the exterior and interior but it is possible to determine its early appearance, based on historic photographs, oral history and remaining architectural details. The school was two stories, with the lower floor for the elementary grades and the upper floor for grades five through nine.³ The interior had vertical wood wainscoting, some of which still remains. The wooden door and window surrounds were banded, with bull's eye corner blocks. There was a north and south stairway to the second floor. The exterior was German sided. There was a central entrance on the north gable end, with double doors surmounted by a transom.⁴ The facade was three by four bays, with 6/6 double hung sash windows on both stories.⁵

After 1926 the building was used at various times as part of a saw mill, and as a private residence.⁶ It was in deteriorated condition when the present commercial concern acquired it in 1963. The present owner covered the exterior with aluminum siding and renovated the inside for use as a storage warehouse.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is an unusually-large, frame building of two stories, with a full attic. It faces west on Oxon Hill Rd., and has a wide, three-bay gabled facade here. There is a central door with a transom. The structure is four bays deep, with four windows on the upper level and six openings on the lower. It is sheathed in German siding, and now has an asphalt shingle roof. Appears that some renovating is presently taking place.






Se E's 'NORTHERN VIRGINIA STREET MAP' For Continuation



