Description:

The Marlow/Huntt Store and J.E. Huntt Casket Shop/Tenant House were previously individually surveyed by the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) in 1974, by the Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission in 1985, and as part of the addendum to the T.B. Historic District form by P.A.C Spero & Company in 1996. Since the time of the previous survey, the store and casket shop are unaltered. However, these two buildings were historically as well as currently located on the same tax parcel, and therefore are being included together as one property. There are also two outbuildings on the property which were not described in the previous surveys.

The first outbuilding is a modern, 1-story, gambrel-roof pre-fabricated shed. It is of wood-frame construction with vertical-grooved siding and asphalt shingles on the roof. It is located to the east of the store building.

The second outbuilding is a circa 1910 shed. It is of wood-frame construction with a shed roof. The building is covered in vertical-board siding and the roof is covered in corrugated metal. The building is on concrete piers. There is a single door-opening on the north elevation, but the door is missing. There are shelves on the interior of the shed. It is located to the east of the store and the first shed, at the edge of a fence.

The fence separates the Marlow/Huntt Store from the rear of the J.E. Huntt Casket Shop/Tenant House.

National Register Eligibility:

The Marlow/Huntt Store and J.E. Huntt Casket Shop/Tenant House were previously evaluated for National Register eligibility as contributing elements in a T.B. Historic District. The eligibility of the T.B. area is being reconsidered due to the limited number of resources surviving in the village. The individual properties which were considered contributing are being re-evaluated on an individual basis. The Marlow/Huntt Store and the J.E. Huntt Casket Shop/Tenant House, constructed in 1867 and 1878 respectively, are eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A and C, as excellent examples of mid-to-late-nineteenth century commercial buildings associated with the development of the crossroads community of T.B. The buildings are eligible under Criterion A for their association with the commercial development of T.B. The store was constructed in 1867 as the first commercial building at the current center of T.B. An earlier store building was located to the west of the current village center. The store building was used as the general store and post-office during the peak period of T.B.'s development. The casket shop is an unusual known example of a commercial building used for specialized functions, including a casket shop and meeting space. The buildings are eligible under Criterion C as excellent examples of vernacular commercial architecture. The buildings have excellent integrity, retaining their original windows, siding and trim. The property is not eligible under Criterion B, as research has indicated no association with persons who have made a specific contribution to history. Finally, preliminary studies conducted for this project indicate the need for further assessment of the archaeological potential of this property. Therefore, no evaluation under Criterion D is being conducted at this time.

Verbal Boundary Description and Justification:

The National Register boundaries of the Marlow/Huntt Store and J.E. Huntt Casket Shop/Tenant House follow the current property lines (Tax Map 145, Parcel 181). This 0.26 hectare (0.633 acre) parcel is bounded on the north by Brandywine Road, on the southwest by Old Brandywine Road, and on the southeast by adjacent tax parcels. The boundary includes the Marlow/Huntt Store (PG: 85A-14), the two associated sheds, and the J.E. Huntt Casket Shop/Tenant House (PG: 85A-15). According to deed research, the property was originally part of a 0.4 hectare (1.0-acre) parcel which was purchased by A.W. Marlow in 1866. J.E. Huntt purchased the property with the store in 1876; in 1878 he built the casket shop on the property next to the store. The same year, Huntt moved the Tomlin store which was next to his residence on the same 1-acre property as the store (PG: 85A-55), and renovated the store into a residence at its new location. Half of the property (0.423 acres) was conveyed to Eliza Luckett when the house was sold in 1895. The period of significance for the property is 1867 to 1920, and the shed next to the fence line dates to the period of significance and is a contributing element to the property. The modern shed is not a contributing element. The current acreage is the remnant of the historic lot.



Description:

The J.E. Hunt Casket Shop/Tenant House was previously surveyed by the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) in 1974 and by the Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission in 1985. Since the time of the previous survey, the property is unaltered.

National Register Evaluation:

The J.E. Hunt Casket Shop/Tenant House is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places, as a contributing element in the Tee Bee Historic District. The Tee Bee Historic District is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A and C and the casket shop represents an excellent example of rural vernacular architecture in southern Prince George's County. In addition, the building is a prominent marker of the late-nineteenth century crossroads community. The district meets Criterion A as representative of the society and economy of a late-nineteenth century crossroads community. Extant structures in the town, including the casket shop, a store and several residences which date to the period of significance, remain as characteristic features of a town which grew as a result of its location at the intersection of the Washington-Charles County Road and the Brandywine-Piscataway Road. The community is eligible under Criterion C, due to the presence of examples of mid-nineteenth century, rural vernacular architecture and later Folk Victorian structures. The five (5) contributing buildings within the historic district have good integrity of materials and the community retains much of the feeling of a small crossroads village.



Description:

The J. E. Huntt casket shop/tenant house is a small (ca. 16' x 24') plain two-story frame gable-roofed building, two bays long, and with only one central opening in the gable end. The principal facade is the west gable end; entrance is through a central door sheltered by a small canopy. Above the door at second level is a 6/6 window. The siding is German, the roof is of tin, and there are no shutters. There is an interior (stove) chimney centrally located in the south slope of the roof. There is no basement; the plate appears to rest directly on the ground. A one-story shed-roof porch shelters the east (rear) gable end. The interior of the building consists of two rooms, front and back, with identical spaces above on the second story.

Significance:

The J. Eli Huntt casket shop and tenant house survives as a good example of plain, functional village architecture in southern Prince George's County. Mid-nineteenth century Tee Bee was a small community which grew up at the intersection of several roads which linked southern Prince George's County with the District of Columbia and other surrounding towns. A considerable amount of land in and around Tee Bee was owned by J. Eli Huntt, who, by the late 1860's, operated a general store (cf. 85A-14) on this lot. Circa 1878, he constructed this small frame structure to house, on the first story, a casket shop; its second story was to serve as a meeting place for "Friendship Council No. 6, Sons of Jonadab", a temperance group active in the Tee Bee area. It was just one of a number of business concerns run by Huntt in the village. After Huntt's death in 1897, his widow began renting the structure as a residence, a practice which has continued until today. Recent development has eliminated the village of Tee Bee as a commercial center, but this small multi-functional building survives as a reminder of the once-thriving crossroads community typical of southern Prince George's County.

The J. Eli Huntt casket shop and tenant house survives as a good example of plain, functional village architecture in southern Prince George's County.

The area of Tee Bee (presently T.B.) grew from a small crossroads community located on the roads which linked the southern part of Prince George's County, Maryland, to the District of Columbia and other towns in Prince George's and Charles Counties. Rapid post-Civil War growth expanded Tee Bee to a village complete with general store, blacksmith shop, post office, doctor's office and several village residences. By 1878, J.E. Huntt had built the small, two-story frame structure to house a casket supply business on the first floor.¹ The second floor existed to provide meeting space for "Friendship Council No. 6, Sons of Jonadab,"² a temperance group active in the Tee Bee area. Incorporating both male and female members, this (secret?) group met regularly in the second-floor space and in 1878 "six hundred square feet with 'building and appurtenances, for the use and benefit of the said Friendship Council'"³ was deeded to a trustee's group for said Council by J. Eli Huntt and Laura S. Huntt, his wife.

J. Eli Huntt prospered in the village of Tee Bee both as a landowner and businessman, expanding his interests into a variety of profitable ventures which, in turn, created more growth and development within the village. By the time of Huntt's death in 1897, this small building was just one of many structures owned by Huntt in the village. With no apparent changes in the structure's exterior, Huntt's widow, Laura S. Huntt, began renting the entire two-story structure as a residence, a practice which has continued until today.

Modern highway development during the twentieth century (Routes 301 and 5) bypassed T.B. and eliminated the village as a commercial center. Tee Bee is now a quiet crossroads, hemmed in by major highways to the east and west. Several late nineteenth century buildings survive, however, as a reminder of the once-thriving commercial center, including this multi-functional building.






BRANDYWINE DIST.


