Description:

The Orme-Carr house is on a gravel drive north of Baden-Westwood Road, facing the road. The house is a two-story, gable roof frame structure resting on a cement foundation. The three bay front (south) facade has a central entrance with three lower panels and one upper glass light, and a dentiled band between the door and the transom. There are two-light side-lights. The one-bay central entrance porch has a pedimented gable roof resting on turned wood posts. Turned pilasters flank entrance, the as do double 6/1 windows. The second story has two 1/1 windows with plain wood surrounds. The south facade is covered with wide vinyl siding. The roof is asphalt shingle. The east gable end has a stucco covering, and an exterior corbelled brick chimney centered on the facade. There are boxed cornice returns and a shed roof screened porch across the first story. The north (rear) of the house has a centered two-story, two-by-one-bay gable wing, giving the house a "T" shaped plan. The wing has wide vinyl siding and a cement foundation. The one bay west gable end has a 1/1 window on the first and second floors, and is covered with horizontal wood siding. There are two gable roof one-story, one bay frame sheds west of the house. set on cement footings. The roofs are covered with standing-seam metal.

Significance:

The Orme-Carr House is a simple "I" house, embellished by its returned cornice and pedimented entrance porch on turned posts. It is significant for its architecture and for its association with the Orme and Carr families. Lemuel L. Orme acquired 115 acres of a tract called Terra Executabilis, in 1867. He built a house which appears on the 1878 G.M. Hopkins Atlas. The property remained in the Orme family from 1867 - 1910, when it was acquired by the Carr family. It still belongs to descendants of that family. The present house was built for James H. Carr in 1912. The builder was a local black resident named Hollyday. An older frame building on a brick foundation was moved fifty feet to the present building and serves as the kitchen wing. The Orme-Carr House was stuccoed in the 1950's. There has been a house on this corner of Baden-Westwood and Aquasco Roads since 1867. A part of the old house is incorporated into the present ca. 1912 structure, which has been owned by only two families over its history, making it a landmark for local residents.

The Orme-Carr house is on a gravel drive north of Baden-Westwood Road, facing the road, to its south. The house is a two-story, gable roof frame structure resting on a cement foundation. The three bay front (south) facade has a central entrance with three lower panels and one upper glass light. There is a dentiled band between the door and the two-light transom. There are two-light sidelights.

The one-bay central entrance porch has a pedimented gable roof with a plain frieze, resting on turned wood posts. Turned pilasters mark the point where the porch roof meets the facade wall. Double 6/1 double hung sash windows flank the doorway. The second story has two 1/1 windows and a small, off-center 1/1 window in the middle bay. The windows have plain wood surrounds. Some appear to have aluminum frames. The south facade is covered with wide vinyl siding. The roof is asphalt shingle.

The east gable end has a stucco covering. There is an exterior corbelled brick chimney centered on the facade. There are boxed cornice returns and a 1/1 second story window north of the chimney. There is a shed roof screened porch across the first story.

The north (rear) of the house has a centered two-story, two-by-one-bay gable wing, giving the house a "T" shaped plan. The wing has wide vinyl siding and a cement foundation. On the wing's east side is a hipped roof one-story addition with a central entrance, shaded by a shed roof, open "carport".

The one bay west gable end has a 1/1 window on the first and second floors. This facade is covered with horizontal wood siding.

There are two small gable roof one-story, one bay sheds west of the house. They have unpainted horizontal wood siding, and are set on cement footings. The roofs are covered with standing-seam metal covering.

The Orme-Carr House is a simple vernacular "I" house, embellished only by its returned cornice and pedimented entrance porch on turned posts. It is significant for its architecture and for its association with the Orme and Carr families.

Lemuel L. Orme acquired 115 acres of property, part of a tract called Terra Executabilis, in 1867.¹ He built a house on the property which appears on the 1878 G.M. Hopkins Atlas of the County. The house and property remained in the Orme family from 1867 until 1910.² It was acquired by the Carr family in 1911 and still belongs to descendants of that family.³

The present house was built for James H. Carr in 1912.⁴ The builder was a local black resident named Hollyday. An older frame building on a brick foundation was jacked up and moved approximately fifty feet to the present building site. This is the kitchen wing of the present structure.⁵

The Orme-Carr House was stuccoed in the 1950's. The present owner is in the process of covering the stucco with horizontal vinyl siding.

There has been a house on this corner of Baden-Westwood and Aquasco Roads since 1867. At least a part of the old house is incorporated into the present ca. 1912 structure. The dwelling has been owned by only two families over its long history, making it a landmark for local residents.






