St. Phillip's Chapel Site and Cemetery

16100 Block of St. Phillip's Road, Aquasco, Md.

The chapel which stood on this site until 1976, was a gable-roofed frame structure with four-bay facades, and entrance through a vestibule at the north gable end. Repairs in 1932 added a low apse at the south gable end, and at the north gable end, a new entrance which enclosed the older vestibule. This chapel burned to the ground in 1976; all that remains is the free-standing bellcote (in which still hangs the bell cast in 1884) to the west, and a graveyard to the east.

St. Phillip's Chapel in Aquasco was the first of two Episcopal Chapels built for Blacks in Prince George's County. (The second was St. Simon's, Croom.) St. Mary's Episcopal Chapel in Woodville (now Aquasco) had been established as a mission chapel in the mid-nineteenth century, and Blacks were included in the congregation. After the Civil War, however, the congregation of St. Mary's divided along racial lines, as was the case in many churches; St. Mary's Vestry in 1878 purchased a one-acre lot on the west side of Woodville, on which the small frame St. Phillip's chapel was built. It was repaired and remodeled in 1932, but burned to the ground in 1976. A merger with the White congregation of St. Mary's was considered but rejected, and the St. Phillip's congregation is now worshipping in the old St. Michael's Catholic Church building in Baden. The site of St. Phillip's is now deserted except for the old bell and a small graveyard. It is significant as the first of only two Episcopal chapels built for Blacks in Prince George's County.

The chapel, which stood on this site until 1976, incorporated elements of the original chapel erected ca. 1878. It was a gable-roofed frame structure with four-bay facades, and entrance was through a vestibule at the north gable end. The original chapel stood on brick piers, and the spaces between the piers were later filled in with cement block. The four windows on the east and west facades had pointed arches and stained glass.

St. Phillips's chapel was repaired and remodeled in 1932. A low apse was added at the south gable end, and a new entrance room was built at the north gable end, enclosing the older vestibule.

The chapel building burned to the ground in 1976. The free standing bellcote, west of the chapel, was not burned. The old bell, cast in 1884 by McShane and Co., Baltimore, still hangs in this bell-cote, but not a trace of the chapel remains. Along the eastern edge of the church lot is a small graveyard, still in use, with several old stones.

St. Phillip's Chapel in Aquasco was the first of two Episcopal Chapels built for Blacks in Prince George's County. St. Mary's Episcopal Chapel had been established in Woodville (Aquasco) in the mid-nineteenth century as a mission chapel of the parish church, St. Paul's at Baden. There were Blacks numbered among the congregation of St. Mary's, as there were in other Episcopal Churches. After the Civil War, however, the congregation of St. Mary's divided along racial lines, as was the case also in many of the County's Methodist churches. Under the leadership of Rev. Josiah B. Perry, Rector of St. Paul's Parish, the Vestry purchased in 1878 a one-acre lot on the west side of Woodville, and a small frame chapel was erected there soon afterwards for the use of the Black Episcopalians of the Woodville area. St. Phillip's became a diocesan mission after the creation of the Diocese of Washington in 1895.

St. Phillip's Chapel was repaired and remodeled in 1932 (see #7). Like its counterpart, St. Simon's at Croome (the chapel for Blacks established by St. Thomas' at Croome; see P.G. #86A-12) it had a sizeable and active congregation through the middle of the twentieth century. St. Phillip's chapel burned to the ground in 1976, after which a merger with the White congregation of St. Mary's was considered but rejected. Instead, the old St. Michael's Catholic Church in Baden was purchased, and the St. Phillip's congregation is now worshipping in that remodeled building.

The site of St. Phillips is now deserted except for the old bell (in a modern bellcote) which stands alone at the west edge of the church lot, and the small graveyard which takes up the eastern section. The Black congregation of St. Simon's, Croome, had merged with St. Thomas' nearly a decade before St. Phillip's burned, leaving St. Phillip's at that time the only remaining historic Black Episcopalian chapel in Prince George's County.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

St. Phillip's Episcopal Chapel was the oldest black Episcopal church in the entire area of eastern Prince Georges County. Blacks were not generally members of the Episcopal Church in any numbers until after the Civil War. It is a great tragedy that the Chapel burned in it's centennial year. The parishioners tried to save some timbers from the old chapel but they rotted. For some time they used the farmhouse directly across the road from the site to hold religious services. That property has now been sold to a white family named Markham and is being used as a riding academy. The congregation has recently bought an old Catholic Church in the area and it is being remodeled by the Episcopal Diocese of Washington to serve their needs. The site on St. Phillips Road is still being used for burials.





St. Phillip's Episcopal Chapel burned to the ground in 1975. It was located 1/2 mile down St. Phillip's Rd. from that road's junction with Md. Rte. 381. The chapel was situated some 75' from the south side of the road and faced north. The bell of the old chapel is still on the property housed in a cement block enclosure. The bell was cast by Henry McShane & Co. of Baltimore in 1884. There is a cemetery on the east side of the building that is still in use.
