DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a two-story frame farmhouse that has been remodeled somewhat. It has a three-bay main (north) facade, with a low, wide center gable in the roof. The central entrance is covered by a small pedimented portico and the door itself has thin transom and sidelights. The roof is of stamped, patterned tin. Present siding is aluminum siding. Most window sash is now 2/2, and there is a modern screen porch on the east end of the house.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The house is a frame structure, built in several sections. The main block is two stories, with an end doorway and two 4/6 double hung sash opening onto the one story, bracketed porch. The doorway has transom and sidelights; the window above has narrow lights flanking a 4/4 double hung sash. Two dormers have bracketed bargeboards.

The south wing is also two stories with a parapet above the cornice forming a false or square front. The roof itself is a lean-to adjoining the end wall of the house. The chimneys for both sections are internal and have caps of three courses of corbeled bricks. The cornice is bracketed, as are the slopes of the gable, with small brackets.

The rear (west) wing is two stories and is two bays deep. The end chimney is internal. The siding on the gable end is weatherboarding; the side walls, like the main house, are sheathed with tongue-and-groove siding.

The brick stable is laid up in common bond. It is built into the side of a hill so the loft is entered from the rear. Jack arches over the openings are one stretcher. The joists are mortised into the walls and into a large summer beam that is supported by two posts, one on either side of the central passage. The summer is scarfed in the center. The present low-pitched roof is a replacement.

The gambrel roofed cow barn is later than the other buildings. It has weatherboard sheathing over a balloon frame.

The corn crib has a hewn, braced frame. Posts are mortised and pegged into plate and sill, with two intermediate rails mortised into the posts. The tie beams are notched over the plate; these carry a thin false plate that supports the lower end of the rafters; at the ridge, the rafters are half-lapped and pegged.



Scale 1/4 Inches to the Mile.




