Description:

The William Young House is a 2-story, 2-bay, side-passage house on the west side of Second Street in Laurel, Prince George's County. Constructed circa 1865, the building is a massed plan with a 2-story rear ell, a side canted bay and an enclosed side porch. The structure has a side-gable roof covered in asphalt shingles, and a parged central chimney. It is of wood-frame construction with asbestos siding, and it has a parged stone foundation. The windows are double-hung wood sash. The house has a 1-story shed-roof porch on the front elevation. The porch has a concrete foundation, concrete and brick steps, and square wood posts and a railing.

Significance:

The William Young House was constructed circa 1865 on a 547 square meter (5890 square foot) parcel of land which William Young purchased from Thomas Talbott in 1865. The property appears on the 1878 Hopkins Map of Laurel in the ownership of William Young. Ownership passed to Isabella Young through the estate of William Young. The 1894 directory of Laurel as reprinted in the Laurel Centennial Booklet lists a Mrs. Isabelle Young and a Charles Young, printer, as residing on Second Street between Main and Montgomery Streets. In 1904 Thomas N. Young purchased the property at public auction. The house was sold in 1906 to George and Lillian Rutley. The property was purchased in 1910 by Henry Clay Suter and Ester Suter. The Suters sold the property in 1914 to David and Frances Fisher. The heirs of the Fisher estate sold the property in 1976 to Gerald and Ester Lubar, the current owners of the property.

The William Young House is a 2-story, 2-bay, side passage house on the west side of Second Street in Laurel, Prince George's County. Constructed circa 1865, the building is a massed plan with a 2-story rear ell, a side canted bay and an enclosed side porch.

The structure has a side-gable roof covered in asphalt shingles, and a parged central chimney. It is of wood-frame construction with asbestos siding, and it has a parged stone foundation. The windows are double-hung wood sash. The house has a 1-story shed-roof porch on the front elevation. The porch has a concrete foundation, concrete and brick steps, and square wood posts and a railing.

The east, or front elevation has a raised foundation which is obscured by the front porch. The first story entrance is located in the first bay. It has a 6-light transom and 3-light sidelights. The second bay is now an 8-light window, and the end lights are 1/1 double-hung windows. The window has been altered from its original configuration as two windows. The second story has three 6/6 double-hung windows. There is a canted bay on the north side of the house, and a 1/1 double-hung window is visible from the front elevation.

The north elevation has been altered with the enclosure of the side porch. The fenestration pattern is symmetrical. The first bay has a canted bay with a hipped-roof and three 1/1 double-hung windows. The main block of the house has two 6/6 double-hung windows on each floor. The rear ell originally had a shed-roof porch which is now enclosed with vertical-grooved siding. There is a door in the first bay and a 2-light sliding window in the second bay. There is a 6/6 double-hung window on the second story of the rear ell. There is a brick chimney on the interior end of the rear ell.

The west, or rear elevation is composed of the gable-end of the rear ell, the enclosed side porch, and the rear of the main block. The basement level has a bulkhead door. There is one 1/1 double-hung window on the first story of the rear ell.

The south elevation has been altered with a second-story entrance and metal steps. The first story has a 6/6 double-hung window and a 6-light fixed window. The second story has a 6/6 double-hung window in the rear ell, a modern door, and a 6/6 double-hung window. There is a small 6/6 double-hung window in the gable.

There are no outbuildings associated with this site.

The William Young House is located on the west side of Second Street, and is surrounded by converted residential structures to the north and south, and commercial development to the west. There are several trees adjacent to the south side of the house, and paved driveways and parking areas on the north and west. The setting is now commercial, but the setting was historically a low-density residential neighborhood in the Town of Laurel.

which ran along one side of the building for its full-depth, and were flanked on one side by two nearly equal-sized rooms. Service rooms such as the kitchen were placed in a rear wing. In town settings, the first-floor front room served as either commercial space or a downstairs parlor (Lanier and Herman 1997: 32).

National Register Evaluation:

Constructed circa 1865, the William Young House is not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. The property is not eligible under Criterion A, as research conducted indicates no association with any historic events or trends significant in the development of national, state, or local history. Historic research indicates that the property has no association with persons who have made specific contributions to history, and therefore, it does not meet Criterion B. It is not eligible under Criterion C, as it is an undistinguished example of a common side-passage type which has been altered with fenestration changes, a new front porch, an enclosed side porch, and asbestos siding. The house no longer retains its integrity of material, design, setting, or feeling. Finally, the structure has no known potential to yield important information, and therefore, is not eligible under Criterion D.


