DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This small dwelling house is one of six nearly identical houses in the wharf area constructed by Capt. John Ozmon circa 1880. Four of these houses stand in a row to the south, and the other lies directly to the south of this house. Of the six, this is the most altered. In form, plan, fenestration and detail, this is an exact duplicate of the adjoining house. The brick foundation has been heavily repainted however, and the horizontal weatherboards covered with asbestos shingle siding. A brick exterior stove flue has been added on the north gable wall, and a one story lean-to has been added to the rear facade.

The interior was not examined.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Clinton Waters House is one of six virtually identical houses at Centreville Landing constructed by Captain John Ozmon circa 1880. According to local tradition, these houses were used by the men who worked on Ozmon's sailing vessels. As a group, they form an unusual architectural ensemble and are significant as an integral part of the Centreville waterfront, which was once an important commercial shipping point for this part of the county.




