Stevensville, Md.

Designed and constructed by George Lane in 1909, the old Stevensville High School is one of several early 20th century schools in the county and appears to mark the beginning of a coordinated effort to develop a regionally centralized county school system. It is similar in size, form and materials to a school building in Queen Anne and pre-dates by only a few years the brick schools in Church Hill and Sudlersville. Smaller frame schools dating to this same period may also be found in small communities such as Price and Crumpton.

The Stevensville School is distinctive for its overall massing and proportions, the eyebrow and sunburst design on the south dormer, and the distinctive open belfry with decorative brackets surmounting the pyramidal roof.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The old Stevensville High School is located on the west side of Maryland Route 8 on the southwest edge of Stevensville and only a few hundred yards north of U.S. Route 50/301. The paved road directly in front of the school to the south is all that remains of the old road south to Romancoke. This road, now Route 8, was cut off and redirected when Route 50/301 and the Bay Bridge were built in the early 1950s.

Erected in 1909, by George Lane, Architect-Builder, this Victorian style building served as a high school until its closing in the 1950s. The 1 1/2 story square frame structure covered primarily with novelty siding is built on a brick foundation and originally had a pyramidal roof with open belfry. Subsequently, a large shed dormer covered with shingles was added to each side of the standing seam metal roof. The school is seven bays wide and seven bays deep and has a small one story addition on its west elevation. A small one story gable centered on the front (south) facade provides protection to the main entrance. Large 6/6 sash windows are used throughout. Originally the school

had four rooms and a central corridor. Between the two rooms on each side there was a closet and a cloak room which when the doors were opened created one large room to accommodate the student body for school functions.


