The Carmichael Methodist Church is typical of the small frame churches commonly constructed during the last quarter of the 19th century. A striking hexagonal steeple with decorative dormers is the primary architectural feature of the building. It is further enhanced by Gothic stained glass windows, German siding, and a bracketed cornice. Interior details of interest include an unusual pitched floor sloping toward the altar and the decorative panels in the ceiling.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Carmichael United Methodist Church is located on the west side of Wye Neck Road approximately 4 1/2 miles southeast of Queenstown.

The church is of frame construction with a steeply pitched gable roof. A small entrance vestibule with a pitched roof surmounted by a tapered octagonal steeple projects from the northeast corner of the principal (east) gable. The steeple is the most striking architectural feature of the building. Three dormers with louvered ventilator openings encircle the steeple and probably mark the location of the bell, the louvers allowing the sound to escape the tower. The dormers have decorated verge boards and deep, overhanging eaves, giving a picturesque air to the entire structure. The gable eaves of the main building and the vestibule are also highly decorative, with a fancy verge board and a deep soffit supported by scrolled brackets with pierced fretwork.

The entrance is located in the east wall of the vestibule, and consists of a pair of paneled doors surmounted by a Gothic arched stained glass

window. Single lancet windows are located on each side wall of the vestibule.

A large Gothic stained glass window dominates the east gable wall of the main building. This window is composed of three smaller windows set side by side, with two diamond-shaped openings above, all incorporated into a single large mural of stained glass. A brick stove chimney has been constructed against the gable wall just to the right of the window, interrupting the facade rather harshly.

There are four Gothic stained glass windows on each facade wall, and a smaller window (previously described) on each side wall of the entrance vestibule. A bulkhead entrance to the cellar is located below the east window on the south facade.

A small, pitched roof chancel projects from the center of the rear (west) gable wall. A single Gothic window is located on each side wall of the chancel, and a smaller Gothic window is centered in the west wall. A louvered ventilator in the upper gable is the only opening on the west wall of the main building.

The entire structure is covered with horizontal German siding, and rests on a continuous brick

foundation. A cornerstone in the southeast corner bears the date "1873", and a second stone in the northeast corner of the bell tower is inscribed

The roof of the church, including the steeple, is covered with wood shingles.


The interior is somewhat unusual in that the pews are semi-circular, and the floor slopes down from the entrance to the pulpit. The pews are arranged to form two aisles, while the pulpit is centered in front of the chancel, surrounded by a low, semi-circular railing with turned balusters. Narrow beaded wainscoting encircles the room below a simple chairrail, and the ceiling is finished with similar beaded paneling arranged in contrasting geometric patterns. The window and door surrounds are molded and are stained to match the ceiling and wainscoting. The stained glass windows do not appear to be original, and probably date to the early 20th century.

Parish Hall

A one-story frame parish hall adjoins the northwest corner of the church. It is of frame construction on a continuous brick foundation, and has a moderately pitched gable roof. A pair of paneled doors with a transom is centered on the east gable facade, and three large six-over-six windows are located on each side wall. An elliptical ventilator opening in the upper gable of the front wall has been blocked, and a frame shed roof addition has been constructed across the rear facade. A box cornice with a deep soffit, a crown mold, and a bed mold extends across each side wall, returns at the corners, and is carried up the gable eaves. The walls are finished with plain horizontal siding, the roof is tin.


