DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The northernmost building of the existing three duplexes is a four bay wide two story frame building on the west side of North Liberty Street between Broadway and Johnstown Lane. It was constructed in 1878 by Joseph O. Raisin along with three other buildings on the lot, the southernmost having been demolished in 1980.

The facade of this house is like the others, in that there are two doors on the outer two bays, with two 6/6 sash windows in the center two bays. On the second story all four bays have 6/6 sash windows.

On the north and south gables there is one window on each of the two floors. Like the three-story house up the block, the back leanto is narrower than the front four bays, and has only two windows on its rear facade (west). There is one window on the gable of the leanto above a small shed entry at right angles of the back leanto. With the small shed entry the floor plan of the duplex is actually a 'T'.

The rear facade has two 6/6 windows on the first floor and two 3/3 sash windows on the second story. Chimneys are centered at the apex of the 'A' roof front section and at the rear of the leanto section. The roof is covered with raised seam metal roofing.




