**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The tenant house on the Gunther Farm is located on the south side of Back Starr Road approximately one mile northwest of Starr, and nearly opposite the front lane to the Gunther house.

This tenant house is of frame construction, two stories high, two bays wide and one room deep, with a pitched gable roof and an original one story lean-to across the west gable wall.

The front facade faces north to the road. The door is in the west bay, with one 6/6 window to the east and two 6/6 windows on the second floor. A single 6/6 window is centered in the north wall of the lean-to. The house rests on a concrete block foundation and is covered with plain weatherboards and a corrugated metal roof with boxed in, oversailing eaves.

There are no openings in the east gable wall.

On the rear or south facade, there is a door in the center of the south wall of the lean-to and two 6/6 windows on each floor of the main house.

There are no openings in the west wall of the lean-to or in the exposed, upper portion

of the west gable wall of the house. A flush brick stove chimney is centered on this gable of the main house.

The interior consists of a single large room on the first floor of the main house with a door in the west wall opening into the original lean-to kitchen. The stove chimney is on the west wall of the main room, with a shared flue for both the house and the kitchen. An enclosed straight-run stair rises against the east gable wall of the house to the second floor, which is divided into two rooms. The lower walls of the first floor rooms are sheathed with horizontal boards, otherwise the house is completely plain.

The house is constructed with balloon framing utilizing circular sawn material and wire nails.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Built circa 1900, the Gunther Farm Tenant House is an excellent example of a house form that was widely utilized throughout this region in the latter part of the 19th century. These almost invariably were constructed to serve as tenant houses and are generally found in locations isolated from the central farm complex, often on the margin of the farm close to a county road. There are several variations, usually determined by the size, configuration and location of the small kitchen wing. The one story lean-to on one gable end is one of the most common and distinctive forms. This particular building, though in only fair condition, remains virtually untouched and therefore makes an excellent example for documentation.


