DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The site of Bennett's Chapel is located on the east side of Bennett's Point Road approximately 1/2 mile north of the southern terminus of the road. This area has recently been divided into building lots overlooking Wye River, and the chapel site lies on the south side of a small cul de sac, adjacent to a modern house.

The above-ground evidence includes a series of brick and stone tombs dating to the 18th century. These tombs were once within the walls of a brick chapel constructed in the mid-18th century by the Bennett family.

Excavations have been undertaken in recent years under the direction of Father Edmund Carley of Centreville. These excavations have located the foundation wall of the chapel, stone floor pavers within the chapel walls, fragments of tombstones, and evidence of the collapsed west wall of the chapel. It is also evident that additional burials are present.

The chapel foundation is oriented on an east-west axis. It is approximately 38 1/2 feet long and 28 feet wide. The foundation walls

average 18 to 20 inches thick, indicating that the building was entirely of brick, presumably one or 1 1/2 stories high. Within the walls of the chapel, there are four tombs, two of which have been rebuilt overtop of and at a right angle to the original tombs. The floor area of the chapel remains partially paved with 18 inch square stone pavers.

A brief description of the four tombs is included below:

Tomb A: Located in the northwest corner of the chapel, this tomb consists of a marble table-top slab supported on a continuous, rebuilt brick base. The inscription is readable but at this time is covered with several hundred artifacts. The complete text has been recorded by Father Carley.

Tomb B: Located near the center of the south wall of the chapel, this tomb consists of four heavily carved Baroque side pieces, with the top missing. The four surviving pieces have been resupported by a rebuilt pad. There is no evidence of the original top or any other inscription.

Tombs C and D: These two tombs have been rebuilt and now overlay the original vaults at a 90 degree angle. The original vaults lie side by side at the center of the east end of the chapel, oriented on an east-west axis. When they were rebuilt, they were reoriented on a north-south axis, parallel to the east wall. Most of the surviving stone flags are in the vicinity of tomb C. Both tombs consist of table top slabs on rebuilt brick bases.

Interred the Body of Elizabeth wife of
Richard Bennett Esq. She was the daughter
of John Rousby Esq. by Barbara his wife and
Dyed the third day of April Anno Domini
1740 in the 58th year of her age.

Very much Lamented
Requiescat in pace

Tomb D is inciribed: "Here Lieth the
Body of Richard Bennett Esq. Who was born
the 16 September 1667 and Died ye _____
October 1719 (?) His Grandfather, who was
also named Richard Bennett was governor
of Virginia.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This archeological site marks the location of the Bennett family cemetery and of a mid-18th century chapel that was constructed over the tombs of Richard Bennett and his wife Elizabeth, as well as several other tombs dating to the first half of the 18th century. These tombs are among the earliest known marked burials in Queen Anne's County, and the unmarked Baroque tomb is one of the most elaborate examples of carved stone on the Eastern Shore. The chapel site is associated with the Bennett house site, which has been located several hundred yards to the east. The house site has also been located but no structural evidence is visible on the surface.


