DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The William Huck Farm is located on the north side of Southeast Creek Road immediately to the west of Maryland Route 218 and approximately one-half mile west of Church Hill.

An early house on this farm was noted as recently demolished when the reconnaissance survey of Queen Anne's County was prepared in 1973-74. The only known photograph of the house is a color transparency taken by Michael Bourne.

The house was of frame construction, 1 1/2 stories high, three bays wide and one room deep, with a single flush brick chimney centered on the west end of the gambrel roof. A second exterior chimney of uncertain age is centered on the east gable. The entrance door is off-set to right of center on the south facade, flanked by a single 2/2 window on each side. There are two 6/6 shed roof dormers on the second story. The exterior on the south facade is covered with asbestos shingle siding and a wood shingle roof.

The interior probably consisted of a hall-parlor plan. No details are available regarding the other exterior walls or the interior.


