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**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Henry Evans Farm is located on the southwest side of Rolph's Wharf Road, overlooking Chester River.

An early house on this farm was noted as recently demolished when the reconnaissance survey of Queen Anne's County was undertaken in 1973-74. No photographs have been located. The following brief description is based on the recollections of Michael O. Bourne, an architectural historian and native of Queen Anne's County.

The house consisted of three sections. The largest, front section was frame, two stories high, five bays wide and one room deep, with paired interior chimneys on a shallow pitched gable roof. This section faced Rolph's Wharf Road and probably dated to the 1850's or 1860's. It had a center passage plan and Italianate details.

A smaller and earlier, two part frame wing extended from the northwest end of the rear facade. This consisted of a story-and-a-half gambrel roof section adjoining the main house and a story-and-loft gable roofed kitchen to the rear, projecting from the southwest gable wall of the gambrel section. The gambrel section was probably constructed circa

## 7.1 DESCRIPTION

1820-30; the smaller kitchen wing was either original or an early addition. According to Mr. Bourne's recollection, the gambrel section had a side-passage plan with the stair passage adjoining the later two story house and a single flush brick chimney centered on the southwest gable wall of the parlor.
