DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Northwest Point is located on the west side of Lands End Road on Wilmer Neck. Beside the brick house constructed in the 1930's, there is a late 18th century frame 1 1/2 story dwelling with two-story frame wing of later date. The old house is the one which is included in this survey.

The old house is a five bay long, 1 1/2 story structure with shed dormers on both sides of the 'A' roof. On the northwest side is a screened porch. On the northeast, set at right angles to the older part, is a two-story, three bay structure which appears to be 20th century. The entire building is covered with weatherboard. Windows of the old section have 9/6 sash, whereas all others have 6/6, all with louvered blinds. The building stands upon a brick basement. Within each gable of the older part is a large brick chimney.

Inside, the plan of the house is now two rooms with service and kitchen rooms in the wing. The original plan was a central stair hall flanked by two rooms, the stair remains in its original location in the center of the house.

7.1 DESCRIPTION

The living room, now with stair, has a protruding chimney breast flanked by two windows on the gable end. The composition of the chimney breast is quite handsome and appears to have been derived from an architectural source book. The mantel has crossetted trim with fretwork frieze of interlocking octagons and squares. Beneath the shelf is a row of tiny dentils. Above the mantel is a flush panel with applied molding forming a rectangle, around which is a larger ovolo molding with crossettes at the top and terminating in a scroll with carved rosette in the center.

The room also has wide trim around the windows, chair rail and baseboard. The close-string stair has a paneled spandrel with basement door, rectangular balusters and square newels. It is similar to the Partnership stair, although on a smaller scale. The main door has panels on the exterior and vertical batten inside. In a corner adjacent the door is a built-in cabinet which conceals the plumbing from upstairs.

The dining room has vertical beaded boards over the fireplace. To the left of the fireplace is an unusual cupboard composed of a double door cupboard and a single door cupboard. This composition is similar to several houses in the Madison area of Dorchester County. The same type trim is also found in this room.

7.2 DESCRIPTION

The second story is divided by board walls, parts of which are original. The two principal rooms appear to have had chair rail originally. When the shed dormers were added, the new lengths of vertical boards were spliced at the chair rail. The wall at the head of the stairs, adjacent the bath, is probably original. The doors here are board and batten.

There is a basement beneath the old part of the house, part with brick floor. As usual, there are arched chimney supports at the ends of the building, the east one having been rebuilt.

Behind the house, to the northeast, is a small burying ground bearing the names of the Malloy and Gould families.




