DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Phillip Callahan Farm is located on the west side of Rolling Bridge Road one-half mile south of U. S. Route 301, approximately three miles south of Centreville. The farm stands on level farm land drained by two tributaries of the Mill Stream Branch of Corsica Creek.

The house on the Callahan Farm is composed of three distinct parts. The earliest section is the center portion of the house. This consisted of a two bay double pile house, probably with a two room plan. It has a gambrel roof and a single chimney offset to the north on the west gable. To the west of this building is a 1 1/2 story kitchen wing with a steeply pitched gable roof. It would appear that this was once a separate building and was moved against the earlier structure. To the east is a larger 2 1/2 story section that is probably the most recent addition. Interpretation of the entire structure is hampered by the difficulty in examining key parts of the building and is complicated by later alterations.

The early center section, as previously noted, is 1 1/2 stories high, two bays wide, and two rooms

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The frame house on the Phillip Callahan Farm was constructed in three separate stages. Later alterations and renovations have made it difficult to determine the date of construction of the original center portion of the house. The overall form and the unusual two room plan with one room behind the other bears comparison with a group of similar houses in this area, all of which date to the last decade of the 18th century or the first quarter of the 19th century. The roof of this early section has been rebuilt and it is interesting to note the unusual manner in which the roof is framed, breaking with the traditional curb plate system almost universally employed in this region.

The frame kitchen wing to the west was evidently an independent structure that was moved up against the original house, while the


