The Phoenix M.E.Church is located in the southern reaches of Somerset County on the west side of Gunby Creek near Cash Corner. Notable for its unaltered condition, the single-story rectangular frame church continues to remain on a brick pier foundation, and it is lighted by pointed arch colored glass windows. Unlike many of its nearby contemporaries, this congregation did not erect a large bell tower. Instead the entrance is marked by a gabled hood supported by stick brackets. The door is topped by pointed arch transom filled with triangular panes of colored glass. The north gable end of the structure is marked by a simple five-side apse also pierced by lancet windows of colored glass. Complementing the pristine exterior is the unaltered Victorian interior which survives with beaded board wainscoting, a turned baluster altar rail, and late nineteenth-century pews and sanctuary furniture.

Phoenix M.E. Church stands on the east side of Phoenix Church Road .10 of a mile south of Farm Market Road near Cash Corner, Somerset County, Maryland. The church faces west with the roof oriented on a north/south axis. Accompanying the church is a single-story church hall.

Dated to 1897, the weatherboarded frame structure is supported by a brick pier foundation and is covered by steeply pitched asphalt shingle roof. The eaves are extended and the soffits are sloped.

The west (main) facade is a four-bay elevation with a gabled entrance in the southernmost bay. A double door entrance is topped by a pointed arch transom filled with colored glass. The gabled entrance roof is extended and supported by stick brackets. A small lancet window marks each side of the entrance vestibule. The adjacent three bays are filled with pointed arch sash windows with colored glass. The marble datestone is located in the lower south corner and is inscribed, "Phoenix M.E. Church, 1897". Rising from the roof is a narrow brick stove stack.

The north gable end has a single-story three-sided apse lighted by two colored glass pointed arch sash windows.

Colored glass sash windows divide the east elevation into four even bays, and an interior brick stove stack rises from the east side. Two pointed arch colored glass windows mark the south gable end.

The one-room church interior has a high beaded board ceiling and milkglass chandeliers. The raised altar is divided from the sanctuary by a turned baluster railing, and the small apse is lighted by lavender glass windows. Victorian period choir chairs and sanctuary pews complete the significant interior furnishings.

Standing east of the church is a single-story three-bay by three-bay frame church hall with a gable-front entrance and six over one sash windows. The structure is sheathed with narrow weatherboards and covered by a medium sloped asphalt shingle roof.


Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

The Phoenix M.E. Church is one of the best preserved rural Victorian churches in southern Somerset County. The simple architectural references to the Gothic Revival style; i.e. the pointed arch windows and doors and the steeply pitched gable roof, are common features for small rural church buildings. Inside, church furniture as well as the interior wall and ceiling surfaces appear unaltered since the late nineteenth century.
