The Sam Green farmhouse is a two-story, five-bay center hall frame house evidently builtⁱⁿ at least two stages. Bracketed eaves and dentiled brick chimney caps distinguish this Manokin vicinity structure. Accompanying the house is a c. 1900-1920 frame barn and a frame privy.

This 188 - acre farm has remained a constant size since it was purchased by George R. Revell and John H. Ford from William S. Waters in 1857. (LW 5/443) Ford's interests in the farm were sold to the Revells (also spelled Revelle) two years later for \$1,106.50_x (LW 6/255). For the next sixty years the Revells owned the property. Captain George R. Revell, as he was evidently known, is designated on the 1877 county atlas map.

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
