This two-story ell-shaped frame house stands within the small village of Manokin, on the south side of MD 361. Construction evidence indicates the house consists of three separate sections, beginning with the two-story, two-bay side hall/parlor house with bracketed eaves. A small single-story kitchen wing extends to the rear. Exposed weatherboards between the wall space, suggest the kitchen was once an independent structure that was moved up to the house. The east gable end ell-section appears to have been the last part built. The north elevation of the last section is distinguished by a two-story bay which is topped by a pediment.

A small single-story kitchen wing extends from the back of the house. Exposed weatherboards between sections suggest the kitchen wing was once an independent structure that was moved up to the house. The east gable end ell section appears to have been the last part built. This section is distinguished by a two-story bay which is topped by a pediment. The entire house stands on brick piers and is sheathed with weatherboards. Medium pitched roof slopes are covered with asphalt tiles. Aside from a few fragments, the window sash have been removed.


