A single corbelled brick chimney with dentils is the most distinctive exterior feature. In 1877, the structure appears under the name of T.J. Furniss as an auxiliary building to the main furniss homestead (now gone).

The Furniss tenant house is a c. 1860-1870 two-story three-bay frame structure facing south with the gable running east/west. The structure stands at the end of a short dirt land off Millard Long Road, just south of Back Creek. Resting on a minimal brick foundation, the house is covered by a medium sloped corrugated tin roof and uniformly sheathed with narrow weatherboards.

The south facade is a three-bay elevation with a center entrance and flanking 6/6 sash windows. A small gabled stoop covers the entrance.

A brick chimney rises out of the west gable end and is finished with corbelled and dentiled cap. The east gable end has a smaller brick chimney with a corbelled cap. Extending from the east gable end is a single-story stuccoed kitchen addition. A screened porch stretches across the back of the main house.



