The Perryhawkin Christian Church is a plain single-story T-plan structure which stands on Petes Hill Road, near Wellington. This rural frame structure, with its slight reference to the Gothic Revival style, is similar to several churches from this period. Rising in the southeast corner of the T-plan is a two-story tower with a pyramidal roof. The church cemetery is located in the east side of the road.

The Perryhawkin Christian Church is a plain single-story T-plan structure which stands on the west side of Petes Hill Road .5 of a mile north of the intersection with Perryhawkin Road, near Wellington, Somerset County, Maryland. The simple c. 1910 Gothic Revival Church with two-story tower faces southeast with the primary gable running northwest to southeast. A contemporary frame communitiy hall stands south of the church, and the early 20th-century cemetery is located on the east side of the road.

The asbestos-sided church rests on a rusticated concrete block foundation and is covered by an asphalt tile roof. Rising in the southeast corner of the T is a two-story tower with a pyramidal roof.

The southeast (main) elevation is an asymmetrical design consisting of the primary gable-front and the adjacent tower. A small hip-roofed porch roof covers the double door entrance. The gable-front has a paired single-pane sash on the first floor and paired Gothic arch sash windows in the upper gable.

The north side of the building is primarily covered by the leg of the T-plan. The wall treatment of this section as well as the rest of the church follows along the same format as previously described.

The community center is a single-story L-plan structure resting on a rusticated block foundation. Six-pane windows light the structure.

The cemetery which contains several hundred markers is located directly across the road with the earliest stones dating to the first few decades of the 20th century.


