The Cokesbury United Methodist Church is a simple one-room frame structure erected in 1876 and enlarged two times. A small aluminum-sided foyer was attached to the front, and an ell-shaped concrete block wing extends to the rear. The 19th-century church has been moderately remodeled inside but retains period pews and slightly newer altar furniture.

The Cokesbury United Methodist Church stands on the west side of Cokesbury Road immediately south of the Cokesbury crossroads. The gable-front church is dated 1876, but has experienced moderate remodeling.

Facing east, the single-story asbestos sheathed frame rests on a common bond brick foundation and is covered by a medium sloped asphalt tile roof. Attached to the front is a modern foyer addition and extending to the back is an ell-shaped concrete block church hall and Sunday School wing. Located to both north and south of the church are 19th and early 20th-century grave markers.

The east (main) elevation is largely covered by the more recent aluminum-sided frame addition. A Gothic arched colored-glass window appears to have been moved from its original location to its new position when the foyer was attached. The marble datestone is located in the lower northeast corner and inscribed, "New Cokesbury M. E. Church 1876".

The north and south sides of the structure are alike with three Gothic-arched, colored-glass windows.

The west gable end has a simple single-bay apse with a narrow 2/2 colored-glass window on the south side. The remainder of the back side is covered by the concrete block addition.

The church interior has retained some of its period woodwork in addition to the period pine pews. A pair of heavily molded doors open into the barrel vaulted sanctuary. Vertical board wainscoting stretches around the room. The turned baluster altar rail survives in front of the small altar space. The altar furniture is of Mission oak and from the Arts and Crafts period of furniture styles.

The 19th-century cemetery contains approximately two-dozen markers.
