Located within a short distance of the seafood packing houses, this small two-story, two-bay frame dwelling is one of the earliest surviving row houses originally erected for seafood workers. The very modest proportions along with a minimum attention to decorative detail characterize most workers housing in Crisfield. The row house was formerly accompanied by several others.

The Jack Jones house stands on the southeast side of Broad Street in the center of downtown Crisfield, Somerset County, Maryland. The two-story frame row house faces northwest.

The c. 1870-1880 two-story two-bay frame row house is the last one of a series that formerly stood on Broad Street. The weatherboarded frame is supported by a minimal brick foundation and is covered by a corrugated tin shed roof.

The northwest (main) facade is a two-bay elevation with a four-panel door in the southwest bay. The adjacent first floor bay and the two second floor openings are filled with six over six sash windows. A cornice stretches across the top of the front wall and is distinguished by brackets.

The side walls are basically plain with perhaps one or two window openings. A shed roof addition is attached to the southeast side of the dwelling.

The interior was not seen.




