Bennet's Memorial Church is located southeast of Crisfield along William Maddox Road. The ell-plan church is supported by a brick pier foundation, and it is lighted by narrow, colored-glass lancet windows. Rising in the northwest corner is a multi-level bell tower that also contains the double door entrance. Fixed in the northwest corner of the foundation is the church date plaque inscribed, "Bennet's P.H. Church, 1898-1934."

Bennet's Memorial Church stands on the east side of William Maddox Road southeast of Crisfield, Somerset County, Maryland. The single-story ell-plan church faces west with the principal gable oriented on an east/west axis.

Supported by a brick pier foundation, the Gothic Revival frame church is sheathed with narrow weatherboards and covered by a steeply pitched asphalt shingle roof. A bell tower rises in the northwest corner of the ell plan.

The west (main) elevation is an asymmetrical facade with a gable front wall and adjacent bell tower. The double door entrance is topped by a Gothic arched transom. The tower tapers at mid level as it reaches the belfry, which is distinguished by turned baluster handrails, decorative eave spindles and corner brackets. The broach spire is covered with wood shingles, and the spire is covered with a metal cap. The gabled elevation has two colored glass lancet windows and a round window pierces the upper gable. The eaves are slightly extended beyond the wall surface, and the lower corners are trimmed with simple triangular brackets. Fixed in the northwest corner of the foundation is the church date plaque inscribed, "Bennet's Memorial P. H. Church, 1898-1934"

The north side is a gabled facade as well with a pair of lancet windows on the first floor and a round window in the upper gable. The other details follow in the same manner as the front gable.

The south side of the church is defined by colored glass lancet windows, and the east (rear) side is partially covered by a shed addition.


