Centrally located in Wenona, the Vetra Store is one of a few nineteenth-century buildings standing near the island harbor. Although abandoned, the store building has not been altered aside from a layer of artificial siding. Combined with its use as a store, the two-story cross gabled frame building was also used as a boarding house.

J.S.C. Vetra is designated on the 1877 county atlas as a merchant and proprietor of the "Deil's Island" store. An advertisement in the business directory provides an idea of his supplies,

Dealers in Dry Goods, Grociers, Tinware, Readymade Clothing, Drugs, Medicines, Patent Medicines, Toilet Soaps, Fancy Articles, Notions, and c. J.S.C. Vetra is also Proprietor of the Blacksmith Shop. All kinds of work neatly and promptly done; also, Agent for the celebrated "Cucumber Pump."

The Old Vetra Store stands on the west side of Deal Island Road (MD 363) in the center of the water-oriented community of Wenona, Somerset County, Maryland. The two-story late nineteenth-century frame store faces north with the principal gable oriented on an east/west axis.

Supported by a minimal brick foundation, the two-story, three-bay frame store was built in the same form as a cross gabled dwelling. Now sheathed with asphalt shingles, the center hall building is covered with a steeply pitched asphalt shingle roof. Attached to the back (south) end of the front block is a two-story, two-bay rear wing.

The north three-bay facade is a symmetrical elevation with a center entrance. There are no window openings to either side. The second floor is lighted by three boarded-over sash windows, and the outside two windows have bracketed hoods. The cross gable is pierced by a pointed arched sash also trimmed with a heavily molded lintel.

The east side of the house faces the road with an asymmetrical elevation of door and window openings. A side entrance provides access to the front block, and two-over-two sash light each floor. The upper gable end is marked by a smaller sash window. The eaves extend slightly over the gable end wall. Attached to the back of the main block is a two-story service wing with a separate first floor entrance and six-over-six sash windows. A plain boxed cornice finishes the base of the roof, and the south gable end flush. From an exterior analysis it appears the rear wing may be the oldest section.

A recently erected two-story section of smaller dimensions has been attached to the south end of the rear wing. Old materials such as turned posts were used to construct a double tiered porch.




