Standing directly north of the St. Andrew's M. E. Church is this two-and-a-half story cross-gabled parsonage that dates to the first decade of the twentieth century. Resting on rusticated concrete block foundation, the three-bay, center hall dwelling is distinguished by a turned post front porch and interior brick chimneys that flank the stairhall. The single-pile main block is extended to the rear by a two-story dining room/kitchen wing.

The parsonage and the church are located in the center of the historic African-American community of Upper Hill, and both buildings contribute to the late nineteenth century and early twentieth century character of the village.

The St. Andrew's M. E. Church parsonage is located on the east side of Upper Hill Road in the community of Upper Hill, Somerset County, Maryland. The two-and-a-half story, three-bay frame house faces west with the principal gable roof oriented on a north/south axis. The house is located immediately north of St. Andrew's M. E. Church.

Dating around 1910, the two-and-a-half story, center hall frame house rests on a high rusticated concrete block foundation, and the exterior is clad with asbestos shingles. The medium pitched roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Attached to the back of the single-pile main block is a two-story service wing.

The west (main) facade is a symmetrical three-bay elevation with a center, partially glazed door flanked single-pane sash windows. The entire first floor is sheltered by a hipped roof front porch supported by turned posts. Centered on the porch roof is a cross gable. The second floor is lighted by three single-pane sash windows, and the cross gable is marked by a single-pane sash window as well. The base of the roof is finished with a boxed cornice, and the eaves are slightly extended on the gable ends. Rising through the center of the house are a pair of interior brick stove chimneys which flank the center hall.

Each gable end is marked by a single one-over-one sash window that light the first, second, and attic floors. The east side of the house is partially covered by the two-story dining room and kitchen wing, which is served by an internal brick stove chimney. Attached to the south side of the kitchen wing is a single-story shed addition. A small shed roofed stoop shelters a rear kitchen entrance.

The interior was not seen.


