Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

A detailed physical description of the Spaulding Barn, including materials, construction methods, and plan description is provided in a State Historic Sites Inventory Form, dated April 1995, located at the Maryland Historic Trust Library. The document notes that while the type of agricultural structures were once common in St. Mary's County, few survive. The date of construction is suggested to be circa mid-nineteenth century. Currently overgrown with vegetation, sitting close to the edge of Vista Road, the barn still exudes the quality of its physical character in form, scale and subtle details. The elegance of the barn's design steps openly forward while the untamed plant world grasps as an outreach of agrarian insolence. The environmental metaphor offers justification for the resilience of rural contributions to cultural growth.

The Samuel Spalding Tobacco Barn is significant as a well-preserved example of a horizontal log construction tobacco barn. Although these agricultural structures were commonly found in St. Mary's County at one time, few survive today.

Constructed of pit sawn and hewn framing, the barn's joinery consists primarily of pegged mortise and tenon joints. The few nails that are in evidence are machine cut nails that hold the collar beams in place. These nails suggest a construction date for the barn of circa 1840 - 1850.

The property on which this barn stands is comprised of part of the tracts "Industry" and "Garden." In 1856, James and Mary C. Wilkinson sold 81 acres to William B. Tucker. Tucker sold it back to Wilkinson two years later and in 1874, due to a judgment in a court of equity, the land was sold to Ferdinand F. Floyd. The Floyd family continued to own the property until 1921. In that year, it was sold by the heirs of Frank F. Floyd to J. Samuel Spalding. The property remains in the possession of the Spalding family today.

According to James Manning McKay, the original house on the property was located northeast of the barn and faced Vista Road. The dwelling was a one-and-a-half story, frame structure with dormer windows and two exterior brick chimneys. The interior of the house consisted of two rooms on the first floor and two rooms on the second floor. Initially surveyed by the Maryland Historical Trust around 1970, it was dated to circa 1850. The house was demolished around 1980.

The Samuel Spalding Tobacco Barn is located on the northeast corner of the intersection of Old Three Notch Road and Vista Road near Hollywood in St. Mary's County, Maryland. The barn stands alone, bordered by soybean fields on the north and east. The farm complex contemporary with this barn was originally located northeast of the structure. The Samuel Spalding House and other outbuildings have been demolished. The barn is no longer used for the storage of tobacco and it has become overgrown with vines. The barn faces south with the principal gable oriented on an east/west axis.

The barn is a single crib structure of horizontal log construction measuring 20 feet wide by 25 feet long with 10 foot sheds on the east and west elevations, and with an 11 foot shed on the south elevation. The barn sheds are sheathed with vertical siding and the entire structure is roofed with seamed metal. The eaves of the east and west gable ends are sheathed with wide weatherboard siding.

The organizational plan of the barn consists of six four foot rooms. A single door opening pierces the north and south elevations of the barn. A window opening, formerly fitted with a series of wood bars, pierces both the east and west eaves of the barn.

The horizontal log construction of the barn consists of hewn and pit sawn logs, also known as planks, that have been dovetail notched into place. In addition, the logs are secured on all elevations by means of vertical wooden pegs placed at the center point in the beam. These pegs provided rigidity to the structure. It appears that no foundation was employed here and that the logs rest on the dirt floor. Floor joists run horizontally from the north to the south elevations of the barn. Most of the floor boards, which run east to west, have rotted away.

The roof consists of hewn and sawn rafters on four foot centers. Hewn and pit sawn collars are half lapped and nailed with machine cut nails to the rafter pairs. The rafters are pegged together at the apex of the roof and rest on a flat false plate. Originally sheathed with wood shingles, the barn's pit sawn shingle nailers and some original shingles remain in place. Circular sawn windbraces attached with wire nails reinforce the roof.

The structural system used to hang tobacco in the barn's central section is unusual. The intermediate tier pole supports consist of 4 inch by 4 inch vertical posts that stand about four feet in height. Boards are nailed to the east and west sides of the posts, creating a pocket on which the horizontal tier pole supports may rest. The upper

7.1 Description

ends of the vertical boards are then nailed to hewn beams, measuring approximately 7 inches by 6 inches, that extend from the north to the south elevations of the barn. The beams are parallel to and about three feet below the barn tie beams.

There are two entries to the main block of the barn. Both are centered on the longitudinal elevations of the structure. The south entry measures 5 feet in height by 4 feet 8 inches in width. There does not appear to be a sill now, although it may be that the bottom log of the structural frame originally formed the entry sill. A log forms the lintel of the door opening. The door jambs are four inch by six inch, hewn posts attached to the log walls with wooden pegs. The door jamb is reinforced with metal spikes and machine cut nails. The north entry measures 4 feet eight inches in height and four feet in width. The original door jambs have been replaced with circular sawn boards attached with wire nails. A portion of the north entry door remains. The door consists of vertical boards with horizontal battens hung with machine made metal hinges.

The west shed is supported by circular sawn and skinned log posts. On the west shed, the sawn posts appear to be replacements that rest on the remnants of log ends that project from the ground. These posts support a circular sawn top plate on which hewn and pit sawn rafters rest. The upper ends of the rafters are half lapped and nailed with metal spikes to the vertical members of the barn's eave. The shed is sheathed with circular sawn vertical siding and roofed with metal that covers over remnants of the original wood shingle roof. The shingle nailers are circular sawn. A doorway measuring 6 feet 7 inches in height and eight feet seven inches in width pierces the south end of the exterior wall of the east shed.

The east shed, though almost identical to the west shed, has circular sawn rafters. A portion of the entry door, on axis with that of the west shed, survives. The door consisted of vertical boards hung with a machine made metal hinge.

The south shed is supported by skinned logs and poles that rest on the ground. These logs support a hewn top plate on which the hewn and pit sawn rafters rest. The lower ends of these rafters are cut in the form of a bird mouth joint. The upper ends of the shed rafters are nailed to the rafters of the barn's main block. The shed roof, originally sheathed with wood shingles, is now covered with metal. The shingle nailers are circular sawn. The exterior of the shed is sheathed with circular sawn, vertical board siding. An entry measuring 2 feet 9 inches in width and 6 feet 6 inches in height pierces the center of the south shed. This door was hung on metal butt hinges. This entry is on axis with the doorway of the barn's main block. Horizontal tier pole supports extend from the top plate of the shed to a board nailed to the exterior wall of the barn main block.


