STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE


Birthplace of Dr. Joseph Oster King on 5/31/1872, son of James Thomas King (1845-1918) and Mary Florence Oster King (1851-1934); purchased by James Edward King (1804-1851), grandfather of Dr. King, on 7/22/1851.

Located 2½ miles south of Oakville, where the Old Three Notch Road and Clover Hill Road intersect. Stayed in the King family until 1943, or 92 years. Torn down recently.

One entered by climbing the stairs to the veranda, the front door to the right opened to the hall, which had a large living room to the left, with 2 bedrooms behind and 3 above. The addition had a large dining room up front, and a large kitchen to the rear.


