This one story house with hipped roof was built in a bungalow style by local hired carpenters and is one of many that were built in this design during the 1930's and 40's for small landowning Negro and white families. Specifically it was built as the residence for Margaret Collins Branson, the daughter of Robert H. Collins, and marks one stage in the transition of housing that for this family is known to have begun with a log cabin in the last quarter of the 19th century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is one of many that line Abell Rd. and other nearby streets, forming the present-day center of the black community of Abell.

This house is built in a bungalow style, one story in height, with hipped roof and shed dormer windows. The principal block is square in shape, with four rooms downstairs, symmetrically located on either side of the central passageway. Into each of the two front rooms are let double windows with double hung sashes, allowing a lot of ventilation from winds off the water and illumination from sunlight as well. Along the entire south length a shed room has been added, probably to increase the number of bedrooms. Between the walls of the back to back rooms on either side of the central passageway ascends a brick stove flue, with openings to serve each room. The house has been freshly painted, the roof covered with red tar paper in a shingle design, and the house is well-maintained.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to Mrs. Branson, this house was built in the 1930's by local carpenters hired by her husband. The design that they used is a common one in this community for houses of this period. This house then represents the form that was popular among small black landowners of that era, who were able to pay for hired carpenters, and it thereby constitutes one stage in the transition of housing. Specifically this house should be seen in line with the houses of Margaret Branson's family; the log house of her grandparents in which her father Robert H. Collins was born; the larger two frame house that he built in 1898 and in which Mrs. Branson was raised; and this one, together with that of her brother, Dickerson Collins, and of her other brother Edward; all of which have been surveyed as part of this project.


