I know of only three Union American Methodist Episcopal Churches in the state of Maryland, St. Mark (Valley Lee), St. Luke (Piney Point) and Graves Chapel (Millington). The U.A.M.E. Church was founded by the Rev. Peter Spencer on Sept. 18th, 1813. Spencer was born in Kent County, Maryland.

St. Mark UAME Church was founded by the Rev. Hezekiah Statesman and 30 members from Bethesda ME Church in 1891. Hezekiah Statesman served as pastor of this church from 1891 until 1898. St. Mark's celebrates "Statesman Day" on the 1st Sunday in October. The original church was demolished and a new church was built on this site in 1968.

The present St. Mark U.A.M.E. Church stands 15' from the west side of Happyland Road near Valley Lee, Maryland. The church is constructed of cement block and was erected in 1968. It faces east and is 36' across the front facade and 60' in depth. I have attached photographs of this structure. It was built on the exact side of the old wooden church that was built here in 1891.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

I know of only three Union American Methodist Episcopal Churches in the state of Maryland, St. Mark (Valley Lee), St. Luke (Piney Point) and Graves Chapel (Millington). The U.A.M. E. Church was founded by the Rev. Peter Spencer who was born in Kent County, Md. in 1779. He went to Wilmington, Delaware and was affiliated with old Asbury M.E. Church (3rd & Walnut Sts.). He and 42 black members of this church removed themselves from their congregation in 1805 and met in groves and fields until they built Ezion M.E. Church (9th & French Sts.) in 1812. Spencer and his congregation fought with the M.E. Church over the acceptance of ministers appointed by the conference and finally withdrew from the Methodist Episcopal Church. On Sept. the 18th 1813 they opened a church on the corners of 8th and French Sts. in Wilmington and it was incorporated as The First Independent Church of Negroes. This church became known as the Union Church of Africans and in 1852 as the Union American Methodist Episcopal Church.

St. Mark U.A.M.E. Church was founded by the Rev. Hezekiah Statesman and 30 dissident members of Bethesda M.E. Church in 1891. St. Mark's still celebrates "Statesman Day" on the 1st day in October. Hezekiah Statesman served as pastor of this Church from 1891 until 1898. The Rev. Joseph S. Statesman, served as pastor from 1907 until 1943.






