DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

In 1968 this house as well as the plantation documents stored within it were bulldozed into a nearby pond. Only the tall chimney remains to mark the site. This chimney, an old photograph of the house located, and conversations with the owners provide the following description:

Located about 30 feet from the butler's pantry on the southern wind of the main house, this one story frame structure served as the separate kitchen for the main house and as living quarters for house servants for a number of years. It was somewhat larger and considerably more substantial in appearance than most slave cabins. Its facade was two bays in length, one door flanked on the north by a double hung sash window. The frame rested on brick foundations and was sheathed by overlapping weatherboards. The northern gable end was dominated by a tall, brick, outside end chimney built in a late 18th century fashion. The owners remembered that the roof was covered by wood shingles. The cornice was boxed. In the interior, the flooring was of planks. The firebox opening, once considerably larger, has been bricked in. In the southeastern corner a circular stairway ascended to the loft. There were no supports underneath or paneling to enclose it.

Another room was built, probably later, to the southern gable end. This did not serve as a bedroom, but as a large pantry where food and cooking utensils were stored, according to the owners.






