Weston, identified in the Land Records as Lot No. 1 of Westbury Manor, is significant as an example of a frame one-and-a-half story, center passage, double pile plan, Greek Revival style dwelling house. Most of the original exterior fabric of the structure remains intact. The interior mantelpieces, endangered by vandals and the weather, also survive. Although Weston has been allowed to decay over the past decade, it is still salvageable.

Westbury Manor was a 1250 acre tract granted to Thomas Weston in 1642. By the early 1800s the property was owned by Abraham Barnes Thompson Mason of Lowden County, Virginia. In Mason's will, probated in 1813, he divided the St. Mary's County land between five of his heirs. By 1834, Mary Barnes Mason owned the 235 1/4 acre tract on which Weston now stands. Mary Mason sold this tract, identified as Lot No. 1 of Westbury Manor, to John Lewis Milburn in 1838.

In 1860 Benjamin Tippet resurveyed a portion of Lot No. 1 for Milburn and identified the 27 3/4 acre tract as "North Saint Georges." Tippet's plat shows that by this time the property was already improved by a dwelling house. Oddly, neither the name "North Saint Georges" nor the acreage of the resurvey are referenced in the land records again.

Based on both archival and architectural evidence it seems likely that Weston was built by John Lewis Milburn soon after his purchase of the property in 1838. It appears that the name "Weston" was not assigned to the house until the mid-twentieth century. The property is referred to as the "Coleman farm" by the current owners.

Weston is located at the end of an unpaved road on the east side of Route 249 near Piney Point in St. Mary's County, Maryland. The house stands in a small grove of trees. Two small frame outbuildings are located on the south side of the house. The remnants of a white paling fence are located on the north side of the house. Cultivated fields extend beyond the house lot on all sides. A line of cedar trees extends south from the house, past a barn, to the north shore of Saint George's Creek. Weston faces south with the gable roof oriented on an east/west axis.

Built between 1825 and 1840, Weston is a one-and-a-half story, five bay, frame house with a continuous brick foundation. In addition to the brick foundation are a series of arbitrarily placed fieldstone piers located underneath the house. A line of mortared bricks which extends underneath the house from the center of the east gable end to the west gable end was apparently added at a later date for additional support. The exterior is sheathed with weatherboard siding and the roof is covered with asphalt shingles. The cornice is boxed and finished with a decorative bed molding.

The south (main) elevation is pierced by a modern central entrance door with narrow, plain surrounds. A three-light transom is located above the door. Two six-over-six sash windows with beaded surrounds flank the door on either side. The roof is pierced by three gable roof dormers. The dormers are lighted by six-over-six sash windows flanked by decoratively molded pilasters.

The east elevation is a flush gable end. Two exterior brick chimneys of 5/1 bond stand against this wall. Much of the stack of the southern chimney has been rebuilt. The upper half story is pierced by one six-over-six sash window and by one six-light window with a single light transom. Both have beaded surrounds.

The north elevation is pierced by a one-light-over-three-panel entrance door. The door is sheltered by a gable roof porch supported by a brick foundation. The porch was probably screened at one time. Its wood floor remains in place. Two six-over-six sash windows with beaded surrounds flank the door on either side. Three gable roof dormers pierce the roof. Like those on the south elevation, the dormers are lighted by six-over-six sash windows.

The west elevation is a flush gable end. Two exterior brick chimneys stand against this west wall. The space between the chimneys has been infilled with a gable roof addition which serves as a bathroom. The addition is pierced by a multi-light window on the north and south sides and by a door on the west end. A shed roof addition which shelters the furnace extends to the south of the bath.

Weston is located on property effected by critical area law. As a result, the current owners value the site as a building lot. The future of the historic house is unclear. Preservation and restoration of the building is highly recommended.

7.1 Description

The house has been unoccupied for the past twelve years. During this time, the interior has been allowed to deteriorate. Neither doors nor windows are secure and it appears that at least one attempt has been made to remove the fine southwest mantelpiece. Animal fesces and chunks of plaster litter the floor. Holes in the plaster walls reveal reciprocal and circular sawn plaster lath.

The plan of the house consists of a wide central entrance hall flanked by a pair of parlors on either side. The doorways which open off of the hall into the parlors are surrounded by a wide and shallow molding. These moldings remain in place throughout the first floor. A coat closet has been inserted into the northwest corner of the hall. The stair rises from the southwest corner of the hall to the second floor. The stair consists of one step, three winder stairs, and then the full flight. The stair baluster has been removed but the waist is finished with a beaded band. A four-panel door with a box lock opens to the closet underneath the stair. The stair flight cuts into the molding of the southwest parlor suggesting that it may have been reconfigured at a later date.

The northwest parlor is the most altered of all the first floor rooms. The wood floor has been covered with linoleum and a dropped ceiling has been inserted into the room. A modern brick fireplace is located against the west wall. South of the hearth, a two-light-over-two-panel door opens into the bathroom addition. A doorway which pierces the southern partition wall provides access to the southwest parlor.

The southwest parlor is finished with a Greek Revival style mantel mounted against the west wall. The firebox has a beaded surround and is flanked by plain pilasters mounted on plain plinth blocks. The rounded contours of the pilaster capitals make the capitals seem almost inflated. The mantel frieze is plain and the mantel shelf is shallow. The overmantel consists of a recessed square panel with a wide surround.

The northeast parlor also retains the original mantelpiece. The firebox has a beaded surround and is flanked by plain pilasters mounted on plinth blocks. The frieze is plain and surmounted by a raised fillet. A beveled molding projects above the fillet and supports the mantel shelf. The mantel is finished with a beaded exterior surround. A recessed square wood panel, similar to that in the southwest parlor, serves as the overmantel. An opening designed for a pair of double doors provides access between the northeast and southeast parlors.

The southeast parlor is finished with the same mantel as that in the northeast room. It does not have an overmantel.

The second floor consists of a central hall and four bedrooms. Four panel doors

with beaded surrounds open into each room from the hall. A bathroom and a linen closet have been added at the north end of the hall. Holes in the floor and wall of the southeast bedroom reveal reciprocal sawn rafters and floor joists. The rafters rest on a flat false plate. Also visible from this vantage point are the wooden pegs which connect the first floor studs to the top plate.

Three outbuildings are located to the south of the house. Two board and batten sheds with gable roofs stand about 500 feet from the house. One of these has been used for storage or a workshop. The other served as a garage and a storage shed. A barn sheathed with board and batten siding and roofed with metal stands further south next to the line of cedar trees that extends to St. George's Creek.

A portion of Westbury Manor was resurveyed by Benjamin Tippet for John Lewis Milburn on March 28, 1860 and renamed "North Saint Georges." The plat shows that Milburn's dwelling house was located on this portion of the parcel. (See 8.6 and 8.7) The resurveyed tract only included 27 3/4 of an acre. Yet, the tract name "North Saint Georges" does not appear in the chain of title for the parcel.



I devise that the tract of land which I have just devised to my five younger children may be devised as above mentioned immediately after my decease, should I not live to make the division myself and I direct that my son John Hough Mason be put in possession of his portion of the said tract of land as soon as the tenant or tenants now occupying it can be removed, which my executors are enjoin to do with as little delay as possible and in the mean time my said son John Hough Mason shall be entitled to and receive the rents and profits accruing on his portion of the said land to dispose as he pleases and I also direct my son Abraham B. T. Mason shall have possession of his portion of this land when he arrives at the age of 17 years, provided my executors think it present and safe to trust heirs with the management of it at that age."

The plat shows that Milburn's dwelling house was located on this portion of the parcel. The resurveyed tract only included 27 3/4 of an acre. The tract name "North Saint Georges" does not appear in the chain of title for the parcel, however.


