

Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*
The mid-20th Century Federal Ordnance building is architecturally unique for St Mary's County. The flat-roof International Style building retains much integrity on the exterior, however, it is the only remaining building of the formerly 800- acre manufacturing site. The office building represents an interesting development in architectural style for a military installation but the context for which the Federal Ordnance would be significant that is the manufacturing buildings and site layout have been demolished. The office stands in isolation conveying little about the history of the military industrial complex located here in the 1950s. The building is unique only because of its location, not as a notable example of mid-20th Century architecture that could be listed individually. A multi-property listing of similar buildings that together illustrate the influence of popular contemporary architecture upon military industrial development in the 1950s along with information about the designers selected for the developments may provide the historical context necessary for listing on the National Register.



The Federal Ordnance Administration Building, constructed in 1952-1953, represents the only remaining building of a once extensive munitions manufacturing plant and testing facility. This assymmetrically massed, one story, three part, frame building housed offices that oversaw purchasing, shipment scheduling, and accounting for Federal Ordnance Incorporated. Today, it represents a significant historic resource because of its association with the manufacturing of munitions during the 1950s for the Korean War, its large-scale employment of women in the county during war time, and finally its modern architectural design.

In 1952 Federal Ordnance, Incorporated of New York, a private firm, announced its purchase of a large 800+ acre tract as the site for a brand new munitions manufacturing and testing facility. The tract included parcels called "Boston," "Sandy Grove," "Friendship," and "America Felix." The company had obtained a contract with the United States Navy to manufacture detonators, boosters, fuzes, flash tubes, powder rings, ignitors, and mechanical time fuzes and chose a site that could satisfy several of the company's needs. The company took advantage of the county's eager workforce and had visions of hiring between 500 and 1500 local citizens. In an interview conducted with Margaret Gass, an assembly line worker at the plant during the 1950s, she noted that a majority of the workers at the facility were in fact women. She remembered that men held most of the upper-level managerial positions overseeing quality control and safety. In 1955, the Hunter Company purchased the property and later sold it in 1959 to Morton-Thiokol Corporation who never actually operated the plant. The corporation demolished all of the factory and laboratory buildings in 1981 and subsequently began an extensive environmental cleanup of the site in order to eventually sell the property. Today, the building continues to be used by the Hollywood Worship Center.

The Federal Ordnance Administration Building is located at the southeast corner of Maryland Route 235 and Friendship School Road just south of Oakville, Maryland. Situated on a site facing the embankment for Route 235, this building represents the only structure left from an extensive munitions manufacturing plant located immediately to the south. An unused road runs south to the old site of the main factory area. This portion of the property has become thickly overgrown with young pine and deciduous trees. Another paved road traces the treeline immediately to the east of structure and is labelled "Road A" on the enclosed site plan of the entire site.

The Federal Ordnance Administration Building, constructed in 1952-1953, is a frame, one story, three room, single-pile, office building with asymmetrical massing and fenestration. While divided into three projecting sections, the building exhibits two, overlapping, low pitch roofs that slide to the north and south. The building is covered with vertical board siding as well as artificial siding, but all of the building rests on a cinder block foundation. Despite being divided into a three sections, the building appears to have been constructed all at one time.

The east or primary elevation is divided into three sections. The southern section is characterized by a large trapezoidal-shaped bay that consists of four large picture windows. Immediately below these windows are five sets of four light casement windows. This section is sheathed with vertical board siding. A wide fascia board projects over the front of this elevation and is part of a low sloping roof that falls to the south. This section of roof also covers the middle part of the building. The middle section is actually setback approximately two feet from the south section. The recess between the two sections contains a three foot high, brick planting bed. This middle section consists of another trapezoidal-shaped bay with three picture windows and a wood door with three stepped panes of glass at eye-level. The roof is cantilevered here over this entrance and requires a metal pole for support. The roof also extends over the low sloping roof of the north section. The north section is sheathed with artificial siding but contains no openings or bays.

The north elevation is sheathed with artificial siding. It is also pierced by five sets of four light casement windows that are located near the intersection of the overhanging roof and exterior wall.

The west elevation is also divided into three sections. The north section, like the north elevation exhibits four sets of four light, casement windows located just under the overhang of the roof. At the intersection of the north and middle section is an exterior brick chimney flue for an interior furnace. The middle section is pierced by a paired set of horizontal, four light casement windows for an internal furnace room and two, single, four light casement windows--one window each for interior bathrooms. The south section contains a four-light-above and three-panel-below wood door and the walls are sheathed with vertical boards.

The Federal Ordnance Administration Building, constructed in 1952-1953, represents the only remaining building of a once extensive munitions manufacturing plant and testing facility. According to George Burch, an one-time employee of Federal Ordnance, the building housed offices that oversaw purchasing, shipment scheduling, and accounting. Most likely architect-designed, the one story building exhibits an asymmetrical massing and fenestration and an almost flat overhanging roof with a wide fascia board. These modern design characteristics make this structure a rare documented building type in St. Mary's County--resembling only the Naval housing located at Lexington Park (SM-490). The building, therefore, represents a significant historic resource not only for its architectural design, but also for its association with the manufacturing of munitions during the 1950s for the Korean War.

In 1952 Federal Ordnance, Incorporated of New York, a private firm, announced its purchase of a large 800+ acre tract as the site for a brand new munitions manufacturing and testing facility. The tract included parcels called "Boston," "Sandy Grove," "Friendship," and "America Felix." The company had obtained a contract with the United States Navy to manufacture detonators, boosters, fuzes, flash tubes, powder rings, ignitors, and mechanical time fuzes and chose a site that could satisfy several of the company's needs. Located between Route 235 and Friendship School Road, the site was conveniently located near the rail route between Washington, D. C. and the Patuxent Naval Air Station so supplies and products could be easily shipped. The company sought to take advantage of the county's eager workforce and had visions of hiring between 500 and 1500 local citizens. The company announced that its workforce would be composed of 25% women and 75% men. In an interview conducted with Margaret Gass, an assembly line worker at the plant during the 1950s, most of the workers at the facility were in fact women. She noted that men held most of the upper-level managerial positions overseeing quality control and safety. Curiously, a series of St. Mary's Beacon articles in 1953 noted that accidents occurred to several workers at the plant--all of them involving women. The unfortunate nature of these accidents was soon equaled by a large forest fire that erupted on the southern part of the Ordnance property in 1954. The blaze engulfed 700 acres in all--200 of which was owned by Federal Ordnance.

7.1 Description

The south elevation, like the north elevation, exhibits five sets of four light casement windows--all located just under the overhanging roof. It is also sheathed with vertical boards.

The interior of building, like the exterior, is divided into three distinct sections. Since the office building is currently a worship center, the function of the interior spaces has changed. The middle entrance lobby permits entry into all interior rooms. This middle section contains doors to two small restrooms, a furnace room, and the two other sections. The north section is presently used as a worship space, while the southern section is currently used for an office. According to Reverend Cleveland Hall, the congregation would like to eventually add a larger worshiping space to the south side of the building.

8.1 Significance

The checkered safety record of Federal Ordnance was slightly improved in 1955 when the Hunter Company purchased the property and continued to operate the facility until the late 1950s. In 1959, the Morton-Thiokol Corporation purchased the site but never actually operated the plant. The corporation demolished all of the factory and laboratory buildings in 1981 and subsequently began an extensive environmental cleanup of the site in order to eventually sell the property. During the 1950s Federal Ordnance had randomly buried hundreds of five-gallon buckets filled with potentially dangerous unexploded munitions throughout the entire property. In the 1990s, the firm hired G & E Engineering, Incorporated to conduct a more thorough investigation and cleanup. Using a variety of means, the firm removed 1,400 pounds of hazardous waste and reactive components.

Today, the administration building represents the only reminder of one of the largest manufacturing facilities in St. Mary's County in the 1950s. The building continues to be used by the Hollywood Worship Center.


