The grave of Dryden Forbes Gordon is located on a property known in the early-eighteenth century as "Broad Neck" near present day Oakley, Maryland. The grave is marked by a stone slab with a beveled edge and a *momenti mori* depicting a skull and crossbones. Just below this iconography is the inscription:

Here lies interred the body of Dryden Forbes Gordon wife of George Gordon who departed this life in the 22nd day of January 1732 in the 22nd year of her age.

Dryden Forbes Gordon was most likely the daughter of George Forbes who died sometime after 1737. According to George Forbes' will, he was to be "...buried at Broad Neck in the same grave my son George was buried and his bones if not consumed to be put in my Coffin..." This was probably the same location as his daughter Dryden.¹ In the same will George Forbes leaves a portion of this estate to his grand-daughter Mary Gordon -- perhaps a daughter of Dryden Forbes Gordon. George Gordon, perhaps Dryden's husband, is also named in George Forbes' will as the executor and guardian of Mary Gordon.

The Dryden Forbes Gordon grave site is located east of the intersection of Maycroft and Ellis Road. The grave is situated on a relatively high, but quickly eroding bluff overlooking St. Clements Bay. The grave as well as surrounding burial ground is overgrown with ivy, underbrush, and small trees. A low wrought iron fence surrounds the grave of Dryden Forbes Gordon as well as Jeanette Bolling -- mother of the current owner. A two story, Colonial Revival dwelling with a hip roof is situated to the south of the grave, but due to owner objection was not documented for the survey.

A stone slab inscribed with the barely legible writing "Here lies interred the body of Dryden Forbes Gordon, wife of George Gordon, who departed this life on the 22nd day of January 1732 in the 22nd year of her age" marks the grave of this early resident of Maryland. The stone lies low to the ground and features a modern concrete base. The edges of the stone are beveled and burial iconography in the form of a skull and crossbones within a circle is located just above the inscription. The stone was documented due to its location near a quickly eroding bank.

Date: August 21, 1981

Notes: This deed traces how the property, called "Broad Neck" or "Bolling Hall" became owned by Mary Jeanette Bolling von Goetz. In the will of Mary Queen (Will Record Liber PHD 1, Folio 442), executed on October 9, 1914, the property is passed from Mary Queen to May Bolling. Mary Bolling died and left the property to three of her children. Two, Evelyn Bolling and Richard Bolling, died. The third child, Mary Jeanette Bolling, became the sole possessor of the property.



Date: November 25, 1887

Notes: Here the property is listed as containing 80 acres. This deed also mentions that Mary Queen had received the property from the estate of her mother Emeline McWilliams. A commission consisting of John M. Dent, Daniel Shanks, and Richard H. Garner was selected in order to elicit an equitable division of James and Emeline McWilliams estate. Some of the property was awarded to Mary Queen. Unfortunately, the court case which documented the division is located in the Execution Record Liber JH 1, Folio 235 which is not located in the St. Mary's County Courthouse. Due to the lack of a bean clause, the chain-of-title could not be carried further.


