Very similar in appearance to SM-835, 38048 Ed Brown Road is a one-and-a-half story, three bay, frame residence with a gable roof and at least one wing. Constructed just prior to the Great Depression in 1928, the dwelling lies on the southwestern banks of St. Patrick's Creek near the waterfront community of Colton's Point. The house remains in a relatively good state of preservation. Further architectural investigations should attempt to identify the floor plan of the house and compare it to SM-835.

Located on the southern shore of St. Patrick Creek, the house at 38048 Ed Brown Road is located just north of the waterfront community of Colton's Point. Oriented on a northeast/southwest axis, the house approached via a short drive that extends to the northeast from Ed Brown Road. The 1.68 acre lot is characterized by a mowed lawn interspersed by mature trees and shrubs. A board fence fronts the property along the road. Two contributing ancillary buildings are also located on the property. Overall, the tract is bounded to the northwest and southeast by residential lots, to the northeast by St. Patrick's Creek, and to the southwest by Ed Brown Road.

Similar in appearance to SM-835, the house at 38048 Ed Brown Road is a circa 1928, one-and-a-half story frame dwelling with at least one wing and a gable roof. The exterior walls are covered with horizontal wood weatherboard and the roof is clad with raised-seam metal. At least one and probably two interior brick chimney flues project from the middle of the roof.

The primary or southwest elevation of the main block is largely shaded by a screened in porch. The porch is supported by a series of square posts interspersed by a balustrade. While it is difficult to identify the fenestration, the first floor appears to be pierced by a centrally located door flanked on either side by paired six-over-one, double-hung sash windows. The northwest wing exhibits a single six-over-one window. Just above the porch of the main block are cornice returns that further accentuate a prominent cross gable. Two six-over-one windows pierce the cross gable.

No other elevations were investigated.


