The exterior massing of the Stauffer Mennonite Church is profoundly similar to Quaker meeting houses constructed in the eighteenth, nineteenth, and twentieth centuries. Probably constructed in the 1950s with the arrival of the first Mennonites to St. Mary's County, the Stauffer Mennonite Church is an important, representative church building that deserves further documentation and comparison to other Mennonite churches in Maryland, Pennsylvania and Ohio.

The Stauffer Mennonite Church is located on the west side of Pincushion Road near the rural community of Loveville, Maryland. The 12, 632 square foot lot is relatively flat and interspersed by tall pine trees. Four stables and sheds lie to both the north, west, and south of the church building. The church building itself is oriented on an east/west axis. The property is bounded to the north and west by a farm, to the south by a residential lot, and to the east by the road.

The Stauffer Mennonite Church is circa one story, four bay, frame building with a gable roof and a gable front entry. The exterior is sheathed with wide weatherboards and the roof is sheathed with raised-seam metal. The roof is pierced by a single brick interior chimney.

The primary or east elevation is pierced by three, six-over-six, double-hung sash windows and a single five-panel door. Each window pair features a functional set of paneled shutters. The gallery of the church appears to be lit by two six-over-six windows.

The south elevation is pierced by six, six-over-six windows with shutters and two five-panel doors.

No other elevations were observed.


