Due to their work intensive nature, older barns in St. Mary's County are typically not used by modern tobacco growers. Preferring instead to use more modern buildings with open tractorways, farmers greatly reduce the labor necessary to hang the crop in the barn. The Tobacco Barn on Old Horse Landing Road, however, is an exception. The axial plan tobacco barn is oriented on an east/west axis with the primary double doors located on the east and west sides. The barn also features two distinctive sheds. Judging from the steep slope of the roof and the overall massing, the barn was probably erected circa 1840-1870.

The Tobacco Barn on Old Horse Landing Road is located on the northwest side of the road near the rural crossroads community of Laurel Grove, Maryland. Oriented on an east/west axis, the barn is positioned a short distance from the road and is surrounded by cultivated fields of tobacco. Still used for the curing of the crop, the barn is situated on a large 192.83 acre parcel, but only about 5 acres immediately visible from the road were surveyed. The property is bounded by wooded tracts to the southwest, northwest, and northeast and by the road to the southeast.

The Tobacco Barn on Old Horse Landing Road is a circa 1840-1870 timber frame building with an axial plan and two sheds. The exterior of the building is clad with vertical boards and the steep gable roof is sheathed with raised-seam metal.

The primary entries of the barn lie on the east and west gable ends. They consist of a set of double doors. The doors were partially open permitting a view on the inside. Intermediate supports for the tobacco poles are visible and they consist of cedar or locust posts set directly on the ground.

The north and west sides of the barn were not visible at the time of the visit.


