The Holy Face convent building is a two story concrete block structure constructed after 1924. It is a poorly detailed example of Georgian Revival architecture. This style of architecture was commonly used for institutional buildings in the 1920 and 30s. the convent building has limited features in its quoins, hip roof and 6/6 windows. Many examples fully articulated Georgian Revival institutional buildings exist in Maryland, the state was a prime user of this style for its institutional buildings like hospitals and colleges. The convent does not possess sufficient integrity of design and materials to be eligible for distinctive characteristics of types, period or method construction.



VICINITY MAP


