St. Cuthbert's Fortune Slave House

Late 18th C.

This house and the main house to which it was attached are no longer standing, but photographs of the 1930's of it show that it represented the log houses typical of the dwellings occupied by slaves and tenants of the 19th century. It was sheathed with weatherboards, whitewashed, and plain in appearance, with a brick chimney ascending one gable end. Presumably it consisted of one room down and another up, since it was small in size and only one bay in length.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This slave house and the main house to which it was attached are no longer standing, but photographs of them may be seen in the collection of prints in the H.A.B.S. collection for St. Mary's County in the Library of Congress. From these photographs by Frances B. Johnston the following description may be made.

The house is a one story log dwelling sheathed with overlapping weatherboards. The walls stand on stone pilings. A chimney with a large stone base and a brick stack ascends the exterior of one gable end. The opposite gable end is attached by an enclosed hyphen <sup>to</sup> the gable end of the main house, indicating this log structure may have served as the kitchen. The exterior has been painted or whitewashed. The front door of plain planks is bordered by a frame of plain boards and has no porch. That door constitutes the only opening into the front. There is no doubt another door in the gable end leading into the hyphen. In the back length there is only a small window which is wider than it is tall. A double hung sash window <sup>with</sup> 4x4 lights is turned on its side and slides horizontally inside the frame which is nailed to the exterior of the wall. The roof is covered with wood shingles.
