

Name: Sedgefield, 26919 Rigby Lott Road

Summary Description:

Sedgefield is situated on a rise adjacent to Maxmore Creek, and west of Rigby Lott.

Originally, Sedgefield was created as a playhouse, or guest house, for the Rigby Lott estate.

The building is a two-story, lateral gable structure, linear in plan with a two-story pedimented porch and entrance wing. The historic core of the house is three bays wide with fireplaces at the east and west ends. There are two, one-story additions to the east, and a two-story wing and sunroom to the west. An entry wing and porch extend from the north side of the house.

The building has also been extended in the rear by a one-story, flat roofed wing. A bathroom wing was recently added to the east end of the house. A boathouse is located on the creek, and an in-ground swimming pool is located behind the house.

Contributing Resource Count: 1

Sedgefield is located at the end of a gravel drive that extends north from Rigby Lott Road. The building is sited on a rise adjacent to Maxmore Creek. The building is a two-story, lateral gable, wood frame structure that is linear in plan with a two-story pedimented porch and entrance wing. According to the owner, Martha Kavanaugh, this building originated as a playhouse or guesthouse for the "Rigby Lott" estate, which was located approximately one-half mile to the east, but has since been demolished and replaced by a modern residence.¹ The historic core of the house is three bays wide, and there are two, one-story wings to the east and a two-story wing and sunroom to the west. The primary facade contains a perpendicular entry wing and porch, and interior end chimneys. The porch shelters an entryway and small window, and is supported by six Doric columns. The porch and columns are modern additions to the house. The building has also been extended in the rear by a one-story, flat roofed wing that spans the length of the main block of the house. The southern elevation of the rear wing contains a series of floor to ceiling windows and a central bay window. A balustrade accents the cornice line, and two Doric columns flank the bay window. A small bathroom wing on the eastern end of the house was constructed in 1988. The entire building has been reclad with pressboard clapboards. According to Mrs. Kavanaugh, architect Mark McIntorff has guided the recent renovation efforts. Modern landscaping, including a circular drive, brick patio and pool have been installed on the grounds.

There is a modern, one-story shed roofed garage north of the main house and an open timber boat shelter adjacent to the creek.

Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

Although portions of this building were constructed in the early to mid-nineteenth century, the property possesses a number of alterations and intrusions which have compromised its historic character. Originally a small playhouse or guesthouse, the building has been expanded and embellished to accommodate modern needs and stylistic influence. The early construction date places it in the Agricultural-Industrial Transition period (1815-1870) under the theme of domestic plantation architecture. Due to the extensive changes to the original form and materials, the building no longer retains its integrity of design, setting, workmanship, feeling or association and therefore is recommended not eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C.


