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DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This building is basically two buildings that appear to be from different periods. The east wing is apparently a wood frame structure on a masonry foundation. The west house is a two and one-half story frame house covered with asbestos shingles. It apparently dates from the second half of the 19th century.

The east building has many indications of an 18th century masonry structure, most notably, the chimney which has a drip cap styled after 18th century buildings. The windows in the east part have rather fat muntins and appear to be from the period. The foundation that is exposed is continuous around the building and is laid in common bond with headers at every fifth course. There is also evidence of some glazing in the headers in the chimney.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Bountiful Farm is of importance as a good combination of early vernacular structures. Like the Eberhard House closeby, it has the same progression of buildings which indicates the prosperity or growth of the family who built the structures. It is, however, a finer building than the Eberhard House for it has dormer windows on the first section and was two rooms per floor as well as there being more sophistication to the addition with its side door with sidelights indicating the presence of an interior stair.




