DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Manadier House is located across the road from the ruins of Old Whitemarsh Church. The building is a two part building in form but three in structure. It consists of a tall, three bay long, two and one-half story, brick wing on the west and a four bay, one and one-half story wing on the east. The latter is two bays, brick and a longer two bays of frame covered with aluminum siding.

The tall part of the house has a door with transom on its east bay. The first story windows have 9/9 sash and the second 9/6. Its north side is laid in Flemish bond, but all others are laid in common bond. Unique to this structure is the fact that the original sills are stone. On the second story there are three windows and in the attic are two dormers with the usual 6/6 sash. A chimney rises from both ends of this section, partly protruding from the gable walls. The south (rear) elevation has the same features except there is no transom above the door and the window above is at stair landing level. There are two basement windows on both facades. On the west gable, beside the protruding chimney is a patch where the basement entrance was formerly located.

The north side of the brick part of the wing has only two windows on the first story with 9/6 sash. Their sills are level with the sills of the main part. On the second story is one dormer just above the cornice, as at Beauvoire below Trappe. The south side of the same brick portion has only one window on each story.

The frame part has had some changes for there is a small window on the first story between the two larger original windows with 9/6 sash. Two dormers light the second story rooms. On the south is only one original window and a double window. On the second story is only one dormer. The windows of this section are lower indicating a change of elevation within. On the east gable, from which rises a brick chimney is a leanto porch.

The Manadier House is architecturally important because it is a good example of Federal rural housing of the upper middle class of the early 19th century. It resembles, in form and probably plan, the Hedrick House and Monkton both in Talbot County.

The building and site is also important for it is associated with White Marsh Church and the priests who cared for the parish.






