DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

One of the well known landmarks in Talbot County is the Welsh Farm. It is a two part farmhouse composed of a three bay long, two story frame section with a three bay long, one story frame wing. Both parts are built upon a brick foundation. The largest part has a central door on both facades, a moderately pitched 'A' roof and chimneys on both gables. The wing has altered fenestration to accomodate a modern kitchen arrangement. On its gable is a newly constructed brick fireplace. A screened leanto porch is built on the south side of the wing. In the south corner of the yard is an early smokehouse.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The importance lies chiefly in the significance which has arisen within the community. Undoubtedly it was the home of substantial farmers when it was constructed. Over the years it has lost much of its original architectural character. It, nevertheless, is an example of early nineteenth vernacular buildings in Talbot County. It resembles a building across Route 50, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Granville Wise, as well as the brick house on Reed's Creek Farm.


