DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Bullen's Chance is located on a small inlet of Island Creek on Island Neck, west of Trappe. It is composed of a very tall one and one-half story section with a lower two story wing on the west and a short one story wing on the east.

The facade of the main part has two windows with 6/6 sash and side door with 20th century architrave. Two dormers are located on each side of the steeply pitched 'A' roof. The east gable has two windows on both storys and a broad chimney within the gable. Actually the east wing covers one window. The west wing is two bays long and extends toward the inlet. It was built in the late 19th century.

Inside, the plan consists of a living room across the north side and a kitchen across the south side of the building. In the living room a 19th century stair ascends adjacent the front door. In the corner is a diagonal fireplace with raised paneling above. In the kitchen is another fireplace, but the paneling has been removed. Only shelves exist above the fireplace. At one time a partition divided the kitchen into two rooms.

From evidence in the basement, it is apparent that originally the building had a central entrance and a stair in a different location. The plan may have been similar to Harrington, Somerset County or Shady Side in Talbot.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Bullen's Chance is architecturally important because it appears to have been built in the third quarter of the 18th century in a form which was not common to Talbot County, but more common to the lower Eastern Shore. The form, however, became quite popular at the end of the century and in the early 19th century as seen in St. Michaels and at Jena.

The building retains many fine features of its early date, especially the paneling in the living room.

Bullen's Chance was surveyed in 1662 and patented the following year. The present house appears to have been constructed by either Robert or Henry Martin in the third quarter of the 18th century.


