## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

South of Trappe Station, on the north bank of Island Creek stands Sailor's Retreat, a small frame dwelling constructed in the first half of the 19th century. The building has a central three bay, one and one-half story portion with outside chimneys plus a one story wing on each side. Only the east wing is original and its use as a kitchen is evident by the exterior chimney on the gable end.

The building's north facade has a central door and porch flanked by two windows on the west and one on the east with three symmetrical dormers above. All windows have 6/6 sash. It stands upon a brick foundation. On the other facade, a porch extends the length of the center section.

The kitchen is only two bays long and has a porch on the approach side which is partially enclosed. The plan of the original house is quite simple, with central stair hall and room on each side. The kitchen then joins the dining room.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Sailor's Retreat is a handsome small early 19th century dwelling which is remarkably intact. In form and plan it resembles Kirk's Cove and Grace Creek Farm near Bozman. Architecturally it is significant as a vernacular form which was used in Talbot housing throughout the 18th and 19th centuries.
