DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Perry Cabin in its present form is a Colonial Revival frame mansion brought to this appearance around the 1920's. Its form consists of a large, six-bay, 2½-story section with two flanking 1½-story wings. The west and east facades have a one-story porch, on the east interrupted in the center by an Ionic portico rising two full stories. The walls are sheathed in beaded weatherboard and the windows have paneled shutters on the first story and louvered shutters above. It is an attempt to convert a vernacular form Federal farmhouse to a stylish Georgian Revival dwelling.

Originally the house consisted of the present north wing as the kitchen, the adjoining hall and stair hall as two separate rooms with corner fireplaces and the present living room. Its stair was probably located in the position of the lower section of the 1920 stair, its landing being in part of the new construction.

From the early period, much of the original trim remains but most noteworthy are the original finely detailed mantels. The hall mantel has delicate fluted gougework, reeding and rope moldings. The stair hall mantel also has pilasters with plinths, etc. Most noteworthy is the living room mantel with reeded pilasters with plinths above and ovals surrounded by beads. A larger oval is located between the pilasters.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Perry Cabin is significant chiefly for its historical association with Samuel Hambleton, purser of the U.S. Navy during the first years of its existence, who constructed it as his home. Architecturally it was far more significant in its original form than it is at present, although it is interesting that much of the original interior was retained in the vast remodeling of the 1920's.

Charles H. Fogg was responsible for the present appearance of the house. He was the owner and operator of coal mines and coke ovens in western Pennsylvania before he came to the Eastern Shore. He lost the farm during the Depression.

The house is the site of the filming of one of the early silent movies, "The First Kiss."

In 1812 Samuel Hambleton bought 175.5 acres on the Miles River from Robert Rolle Richardson (35/240). He paid \$2808 current money of Maryland for the portions of tracts that had born the names of "The Beach," "Davenport," "Elliot's Lot," and "Stopper." These lands were laid out and patented prior to 1668 to John Hollingsworth, and acquired by Richardson in 1780 (21/119). The description of the boundaries speaks of the "Old House Cove," and from later accounts, it would seem that Hambleton bought some sort of house with his farm land.

Samuel Hambleton was born in 1777, the second son of William and Nancy Needles Hambleton. Martingham was their family seat. Samuel had an indifferent education, but obtained an appointment as Purser in the U.S. Navy in 1806. In 1812 he was assigned to duty in Newport, R.I., where began his long and intimate association with Oliver Hazard Perry. They fought side by side in the Battle of Lake Erie, and Hambleton was later awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for his valiant service in that battle.

Hambleton named his newly-acquired home for his Commodore and dear friend, and it is said that Perry visited here several times. According to the account of Dr. Samuel A. Harrison, who knew Hambleton personally, there was a house, very plain in style, when Hambleton purchased the property in 1812, and the new owner added to this as the necessity arose for more space (Mr. Tilghman).

The domestic arrangement at Perry Cabin was somewhat unusual. Samuel's younger brother, John, was also a Purser in the U.S. Navy. Neither ever married, but they shared the living accommodations, and whenever one or the other was home from duty, they laid out the agrarian plans for the farm. Their sister, Lydia, also unmarried, carried out these plans and was general overseer and hostess for the plantation. Another unmarried sister, Louisa, completed the household. It is said that their hospitality was generous and their contributions to the poor munificent.

When Samuel Hambleton died in 1851, he left the farm in charge of his brother, John, and Perry Cabin to his sisters as their home during their lifetime (Will JH 10/54).

Lydia survived her sister and left the property to her niece, Susan Hambleton Dawson (11/423). Susan took a mortgage on these holdings in 1883 from a cousin,

Josephine Owings. A default on this mortgage forced a public sale and the house and farm lands were bought by Dr. Glascock in 1904 (135/318). The doctor soon sold the property to Charles H. Fogg, of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania (150/140). Fogg added the "newer wing," and turned the premises into a "summer hotel" type of enterprise. This went along well until the Depression forced him to sell the estate to Davis C. Burroughs, also of Pittsburgh (239/510). In 1940 Edward B. Watkins, the present owner, bought the house and farmlands.

Mr. Watkins and his late wife have made their home here, and their daughter, Elsie Hunteman, runs a riding school of distinction on the property and the farm is again being cultivated in crops and pastures.





