Soon after the present Talbot County Court House was constructed in 1794, a number of brick row buildings were built along North Washington Street to accomodate the merchants and tradespeople of the growing town. Number 107 North Washington, was one of these. This building was probably constructed after a fire in 1808 destroyed several earlier buildings which stood along Federal Street and the southern portion of this block. Two-and-a-half stories high, the brick structure is only two bays wide. Greatly altered, it, however, retains the Federal detailing - fluted pilasters and Adamesque sunbursts - on the single dormer.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two bay Federal type building stands on the west side of Washington Street in a row of contemporary structures now used to house commercial enterprises.

The structure is two-and-a-half stories in height and covered by a gable roof. The wall of the adjacent structure #111 North Washington (T-22) rises to form a brick roof curtain which separates the two buildings. At the south side of this structure stands #103-105 North Washington, the old Brick Hotel. The facades of these two buildings are continuous, laid in Flemish bond brick; apparently they were constructed at the same time. Double chimneys rise at this party wall; they have simple caps and are joined by a brick curtain.

The two windows on the second floor of this structure have keystone lintels of sandstone. Set flush with the surface brick, they display the shallow chiseled reedings and flutings seen in several of Easton's other Federal period buildings. Window frames, beaded and trimmed with quarter round back bonds hold one over one replacement sashes.

There is one gable dormer, off center, in each roof slope. The windows are rounded-headed with a semi-circular upper pane; sashes are six over three. There is a cornice and return. Fluted pilasters are topped by Adamesque sunbursts. The box cornice is trimmed with crown and bed moldings.

The first floor of this structure is used as an office; upper floors are vacant and inaccessible. A black glass storefront has replaced windows and door on the first floor. At the rear of the building is a two story, brick ell which appears to have been constructed after the main portion of the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Soon after the present Talbot County Court House was constructed in 1794, a number of brick row buildings were built along North Washington Street to accomodate the merchants and tradespeople of the growing town. Number 107 North Washington, was one of these and represents the first major architectural style found in the town, Federal. This building was probably constructed after a fire in 1808 destroyed several earlier buildings which stood along Federal Street and the southern portion of this block.

Samuel Groome bought the parcels of land, 72' on the west side of Washington Street and 262' on the north side of Federal "Alley", as it was then called, in 1815, from John and Harriett Emory. All the buildings on this corner, including a tavern, stables and premises had just previously been burned out. Samuel Groome's daughter Anna Matilda married Philemon Feddiman in 1840. She inherited this shop and dwelling area from her father and their son Morris sold it to Henry T. Goldsborough in 1863. At this time, Dr. Joseph Chamberlaine had leased the property and Levin Campbell was the pharmecist. Henry Goldsborough devised the property to his sister, Maria, wife of Alexis Pascault. In 1901 Maria Pascault sold her interest in the store and dwelling to her son Alexis G. Pascault for \$1000.00. He lost the parcel of land and premises and it came into the possession of Elsie Watkins. When she died, it was devised to her daughter and granddaughter Elsie Watkins Hunteman and Sharon Leigh Hunteman. They sold it to Anne N. B. Lockhart in 1974 and she is the present owner.



<p>This is the first in a row of four Federal dwellings now used as commercial structures which make up a very pleasing row of buildings along the main street of Easton. This building is two bays wide with an A-roof which slopes from front to rear. The first storey now has a nondescript storefront. The second storey sashes are replacements but the window frames have flat white arches with double keystones. There is one peaked dormer placed off-center on the roof. It has a 9/6 window with a round arched top.</p> <p>From the appearance of this structure it is likely that it was part of a larger structure now hidden by the remodeling of the old Brick Hotel which it adjoins. The line of brick between the two buildings is unbroken and the window arches are identical.</p> <p>In its present condition it offers the possibility of becoming an attractive addition to Washington St. It should take heed from its neighbors which have been well-maintained while still keeping their</p>




