DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a charmingly simple 18th century one story brick house. The east side is laid in Flemish bond, the west side in English bond, and the gable ends in 3:1 common bond. Random glazed headers appear in the brickwork. The house has a brick water table and an ovolo and ogee molded cornice. There is an interior brick chimney at either end. Each side has a central door with a 6/6 sash window to either side, and three gabled 6/6 sash dormer windows. There is a later tiny sash window in the attic at either gable end. The exterior window trim has a small bead.

The exterior doors open into the south room. At the south end of this room a winding boxed stair, with a closet beneath, rises to the loft.

There are modern one story brick additions to the south and north. The north addition replaces an earlier kitchen.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Lowe's Point is one of the few basic "hall and parlour plan" houses remaining in Talbot County. It is similar to Beaver Neck on the east side of the County, although lacking the latter's white walls. It is an important vernacular form which was predominant in Talbot County during the Eighteenth Century.
