

The present austere appearance of St. Paul's Church is very different from that designed by its builders in 1858. Originally there were ornately carved brackets along the eaves of the roof and steeple tower, and above the central entrance was a round-arched hood also with carved brackets. Furthermore, carved finials topped the corners of the main block as well as the steeple.

It is not known when these decorative features were removed.

When Old Whitemarsh Church (T-137) was abandoned in the 1850s, the silver communion service received from England in 1738, the wood alms box, and the Bible were given to St. Paul's.
