DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Money Make Farm is a telescopic form dwelling apparently dating from the nineteenth century. The tallest portion is the most recent major portion of the house. It is a three bay long frame building, two full stories tall with a gable in the central bay of the roof, typical of the last quarter of the nineteenth century. The windows have 2/2 sash. A screened porch extends across its north facade. The east chimney is built within the gable while the west chimney pierces the roof of the middle section. The middle section is a two bay long part with a single dormer on each side of the steep 'A' roof. The south side also has a small shed-like appendage which creates headroom inside for the stair. The third portion is lower and has no dormers. Its facade has two windows and a central door. Across the south side of the two lower parts extends an enclosed porch. The walls of the house are covered with aluminum siding.

Inside, there is a center stair hall with single room on each side. Original trim exists throughout including the slate mantel with marble graining and the grained woodwork. The balustrade is typical of the 1880's except for the newel post, which is period, but overwhelmingly large for the small hall. In the west room is a mantel which probably came originally from the earlier middle section. A balustrade in the middle section appears partially original. It now ascends in one flight to the two story part. Originally, it ascended in the corner to the room above. This portion appears to date from the second quarter of the nineteenth century. Most of the lower portions have been remodeled and the remainder of original work has been covered.

An original nineteenth century meathouse exists south of the dwelling.
